Dear Simon,

Proposal: Fosse Green Energy Project

I write to update the safeguarding position of the Ministry of Defence (MOD) in relation to the above proposed development.

The Defence Infrastructure Organisation (DIO) Safeguarding Team represents the MOD as a consultee in UK planning and energy consenting systems to ensure that development does not compromise or degrade the operation of Defence sites such as aerodromes, explosives storage sites, air weapon ranges, and technical sites or training resources such as the Military Low Flying System.

The MOD did not receive notification of the acceptance of the development consent order application for Fosse Green Energy Project on the 29<sup>th</sup> September 2025, , subsequently the MOD did not make relevant representations within the relevant representation period. Following contact by The Planning Inspectorate about this on 28<sup>th</sup> October 2025, the MOD has reviewed the application and has the following comments to make:

The proposed development site occupies statutory safeguarding zones surrounding RAF Waddington and RAF Cranwell.

The MOD has commented previously on this project, in a letter sent to the applicant dated 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2024. Within this response we advised the applicant of additional receptors that the Glint and Glare Assessment would need to account for.

Upon reviewing the documents submitted for the development consent order, the applicant has submitted an updated Glint and Glare Assessment report as part of their application, which the MOD has assessed. As requested, the updated assessment accounts for potential impacts on RAF Waddington's eastern and western circuits. The MOD accepts there will be no impact on military aircraft caused by glint and glare from the proposed development. I can therefore confirm the MOD has no objections to this application.

As requested in the Procedural Decision Letter dated 21<sup>st</sup> November 2025, the MOD and the applicant Fosse Green Energy Ltd have worked on a Statement of Common Ground (SoCG) together. We have reached agreement on the matter of Glint and Glare.

The MOD recognises that cranes, tall plant equipment, or other tall temporal structures may be required during the implementation of development on any part at this site. The deployment of such equipment could impact upon the safe and effective operation of RAF Waddington and RAF Cranwell. The MOD therefore has informed the applicant that we require prior notification if tall construction equipment such as cranes is to be used during the construction or decommissioning phases of the proposed development. This has been captured within the SoCG and is under discussion with the applicant.

In summary, the MOD has no safeguarding objections to this proposed development. This is on the basis that the MOD is given prior notification of the use of tall construction equipment such as cranes.

I would be grateful if you could acknowledge receipt of this letter.
