*There is a remaining need for a mechanism to secure the effective integration of the **soils** management plan and the **ecological** management plan with the **archaeological** approach set out in the framework WSI and avoid conflict between competing considerations between these or other relevant plans. Works subject to these three considerations need to be coordinated via the CEMP as design develops through the post DCO period into construction, operation and decommissioning including any works associated with reinstatement to previous land uses.*

We are working with the applicant to update the SoCG to reflect the above latest position.
