We are writing under rule 17 of the Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010, further to the submission of the final and signed statement of common ground (SoCG) between Phillips 66 Limited (P66) and the applicant.

The SoCG records that with respect to protective provisions there remain matters that are under discussion. In that regard the Examining Authority notes, in the context of seeking protection from alternating current (AC) interference, P66 is seeking protection from additional load to the existing overhead transmission cables arising from the operation of the proposed development.

Explain how any additional load being transmitted via the existing overhead cables, leading to AC interference for the pipeline, could be attributed to the proposed development, when those cables might be required to transmit electricity from various nearby proposed solar farms (including the proposed development) and/or battery energy storage systems.
