#### 1. NOTICE OF HEARINGS

- 1.1. Notice is hereby given that, at the dates, times and locations set out below, the following Hearings will be held by the Examining Authority (on behalf of the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero (the "Secretary of State")) for the examination of the application made by FVS Dean Moor Limited (registered company number: 14712545) of 127 Cheapside, London, United Kingdom, EC2V 6BT (the "Applicant") for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") under sections 14, 15 and 37 of the Planning Act 2008 (the "Application").
- 1.2. The Application is for the development consent for the proposed Dean Moor Solar Farm (the "Proposed Development") which is a renewable energy scheme situated within the administrative area of Cumberland Council, between the villages of Gilgarran and Branthwaite in West Cumbria.
- 1.3. The Application (Reference No. EN010155) was submitted to the Secretary of State via the Planning Inspectorate on 24 March 2025 and was accepted on 15 April 2025. The Examining Authority was appointed on 28 April 2025 to examine the Application, and the Examination began on 22 July 2025.

#### 2. SUMMARY OF THE PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

- 2.1. The Proposed Development comprises the construction, operation, and decommissioning of a solar photovoltaic ('PV') energy generating station with a total capacity exceeding 50 megawatts comprising solar PV arrays, grid connection infrastructure, associated infrastructure, and green infrastructure.
- 2.2. The Proposed Development will be located on approximately 276.5 hectares of land located between the villages of Gilgarran and Branthwaite in West Cumbria, which is situated within the administrative area of Cumberland Council. - 2.3. The Proposed Development is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) pursuant to section 14(1)(a) and 15(1) and (2) of the Planning Act 2008 as an onshore generating station in England with a capacity exceeding 50 megawatts. As a NSIP, the Proposed Development requires consent through the Development Consent Order (DCO) process.
- 2.4. The Proposed Development is an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) development, as defined by the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 and accordingly an Environmental Statement (ES) accompanies the Application.
- 2.5. The DCO, if granted, would enable the acquisition of new rights over land and contain powers for the possession and use of land on a temporary basis (to facilitate the construction of the Proposed Development). The DCO would also authorise the construction of temporary and permanent accesses to the Proposed Development, street works and highway works, and the application and disapplication of certain legislation.
