Purpose of CAH

I am Matthew Woodward, the Examining Authority (ExA) for the proposed development. I will be leading the compulsory acquisition hearing (CAH).

The compulsory acquisition hearing (CAH) is being held to enable me to inquire into the applicant's case to compulsorily acquire land or rights over land, or to take temporary possession (TP) of land. It also seeks to discharge my duty to hear from persons 'affected' by compulsory acquisition (CA) and TP proposals who have requested to be heard. The CAH will enable me to consider whether relevant legal and policy tests applicable to CA and TP have been met.

Attendees

All affected persons (APs) are invited to attend the hearing. However, as the event is being held as a blended event, it would assist with the running of the hearing if you could let the Inspectorate's Case Team know if you wish to participate in the hearing (if you have not already done so) so that the relevant instructions can be sent for you to join the event.

Please note that the hearing will also be livestreamed for those who may wish to view but not participate directly. Details of how to access the livestream will be made available on the <u>project page</u> of the National Infrastructure Planning website closer to the hearing date.

Procedure at CAH

Each AP is entitled to make oral representations. Participants may be legally represented if they wish, but the hearings will be conducted to ensure that legal representation is not required

Guidance under the Planning Act 2008 (PA2008) and the Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010 provide that it is the ExA that will probe, test and assess the evidence through direct questioning of persons making oral representations at hearings. As such, questioning at the hearing will be led by me as the ExA.
