But first of all, I would like to refer to the meeting of the specific hearing of the 20th of October. One of the most important issues we spoke about was transport and access. And I wish to issue I wish to highlight issues relating specifically to the applicant's proposals for the use of car lane to access the solar farm, particularly during the construction period.

At the meeting, there was a lot of discussion on the unsuitability of Park Lane and issues surrounding that with with regard to access, but please correct me if I'm wrong. As far as I can recall, Caroline was not actually included in the discussion, although I know that the applicant has has been engaging with the people involved. But just to. For anyone that is not aware, Chas Lane is a very long, narrow, single track country lane that leads off the A1 65, and my contention is that it is totally unsuitable for use by its JVs.

It leads to land owned by the peel family, and I have their permission to speak on their behalf. They have a smallholding of 20 plus acres at the end of Kaleen, from which they operate, a small business which is a nursery plants, so they regularly rely on customers accessing their business by driving

down the single track road. If the project proceeds as planned, the their smallholding will be totally surrounded by solar panels solar panels.

The family will be effectively imprisoned, but more importantly, considerable damage should be done to the operation of their business. If multiple HGV movements take place over a long construction period, specifically on the issue of access, I feel that the developer should have another look at an alternative route off the A1, I-65. I. This is. This would be via mr. Steven Kelly's land.

I understand that Mr. Taylor has already been receptive to the developer's proposals, and the panels are due to be situated on his land. But I also believe that the lack of a suitable turning point at the moment, from the main road onto Mr. Kelly's lane, has proved to be an obstacle. However, it would be my contention that there would be considerable benefit to mitigating this by spending a small amount of money, which I am sure that the East Riding would not object to in planning grounds to allow for a slip lane into the land, and therefore I suggest that the lack of the slip wing could be easily alleviated at minimal cost, and that not only would it mitigate against some of the impact being experienced by the peel family, which is considerable at both on the business front and on the mental wellbeing front.

Uh, identifying and utilizing this alternative route could be seen as a gesture of goodwill, and I am sure it would be looked at that on. On the part of the peel family. I'd also like to mention the other another issue that came up at the previous meeting. This was the issue of decommissioning at the end of what, you know, we have referred to as the temporary 40 year contract when over the lifetime of the scheme, a number of people have spoken to me of their concerns that so many, so many things can happen in a 40 year period.

And although I would, I would not wish to see it under any circumstances. We simply cannot predict the future. So with regard to decommissioning 40 or 50 years down the road, I think it is right to give people reassurances that decommissioning will go ahead regardless of any unforeseen developments. I've already taken this up with the examining authority and with RWA, who have kindly responded to say that the use of s e s r o w agreements will be in place.

It will be put in place before, before, before the project goes ahead. My understanding is that an escrow agreement involves the developer putting a fixed sum of money into a protected ring fenced account bank account looked after by a firm of solicitors, and that that money can be accessed in the event that the decommission is about to take place and the developer, RWA, has either gone bust or has maybe sold its interest in the project to a third party.

And I think if we can give some reassurances and that I realize that obviously as a not as an individual or an organization, I wouldn't expect to see the specific details of such a contract. But I would like to ask if this is a this is a term that I have been advised to use if the heads of terms of the agreement

could be available, because I think if we could, if we could give that basic assurance that at the in the, in the unlikely event of something happening unforeseen, that that money would be definitely available so that whoever happens to be responsible for the land at the time of decommissioning will be, will be fully reimbursed.

Because these might be a couple of issues that are more appropriate to the issues specific hearing yesterday. They relate to issues of flooding, and I've sent the examining authority photographs that were taken last week of the Holderness Drain, which is within 12in at the moment of overtopping and causing massive flood damage. I realize that flood risk assessments have taken place, but over the course of a 40 year period, I think that is something that has to be looked at again, something that could impact on fire safety.

I believe that there might be someone from the fire authority attending the meeting tomorrow, in which case I can put the questions to them, because a number of stories have arisen recently about fires, particularly in solar farms that were developed some years ago. There is also the issue that has come up, you might remember at the very start of this process, Mr. Chair, I raised issues about supply lines and the potential for enforced labour to be used. Given that we are so dependent on panels and infrastructure being supplied from China.

Only last week I got a case involving two alleged Chinese spies had to be dropped because the government was not in a position to identify China as a risk to our national security. I have written to the Defence Secretary about this because he is ultimately responsible for this, and he has only recently objected to a solar farm in his constituency in South Yorkshire. I have also written to the chair of the Foreign Affairs Select Committee to get their reassurances that if these projects go ahead and we are talking obviously this is a much wider issue than pear tree health.

It applies across the country, but what we have in common is this dependence. Likely dependence for the foreseeable future on imported technology from China, and the security risks to our national security that are involved. Um, it's also right to acknowledge that we have a number of measures set out in the outline construction traffic management plan and the relevant library reference.

There is rep five, dash 071 and um in particular along Carr Lane. The applicant is seeking the ability to make provision for passing places. Um, and the, the, uh, the usefulness of these passing places is that it will allow traffic to travel in, in both directions. So one vehicle traveling in one direction can pull in, and that will allow another vehicle coming in the other direction to pass.

And so we say that those measures are in addition to others in the outline and construction management plan, which also includes provision for the banks, people and signage. We say that that will serve to reduce the impact, um, of of the use of car lane. And, and that is the basis on which we've

been able to conclude that there would be no impact on on line or a negligible impact. Um, as I say, we've made, uh, detailed notes in relation to the other points which missed.
