

Whilst in favour of the principle of Solar generation, the scale and scope of the proposed development is utterly out of context with the rural nature of the area.

Having endured the disruption of HS2, the Calvert incinerator plant and with the Grendon / Springhill prison extension on the cards, haven't the local residents suffered enough?

Specifically, I should like to object on the grounds of:

- loss of amenity. As a keen cyclist, I regular travel the roads between Winslow and the Claydons. In addition, as a family we like to take walks around the footpaths in the area to admire the views and enjoy the peace of the countryside. This is now compromised, both in terms of the road network with numerous lorries and trucks thundering down the road and the countryside with eyesore views, the hum of batteries and the restriction of footpaths whilst construction is underway

- scale of the development. Bigger isn't better - and with smaller developments already approved / in build or completed, these will be dwarfed by the mammoth size of the proposal, which I understand will be several times the size of Winslow itself!

Overall, the semi-industrialisation of the area is not something to be welcomed. Please take these thoughts into consideration.
