

I would like to express my serious concerns over road safety during the construction of Rosefield . The Granborough/Hogshaw Road, which is a failed road is not suitable for any kind of construction traffic. (photo attached) I honestly already have to warn people visiting me on the conditions, 2 years of construction traffic added to this is a disaster waiting to happen. I feel very sad that some very close family members now refuse to drive to visit me as the road is almost impassable.

I also worry for the families visiting The Hogshaw Farm and wildlife park having to pull out of the carpark with not great visibility with large construction vehicles continually passing.

The bend on Claydon Road coming down from Boltolph Claydon, this is a very dangerous turn, there are often cars in the ditch here as unless it's dark and cars have their lights on you can not see cars coming round the bend. I am not exaggerating when I warn my family driving home every time to be careful. How is this going to be with the construction vehicles.

Any mitigation offered is almost an insult, this is a very rural unspoilt location with plenty of wildlife. I have attached a screen grab from a walk I was on a few weeks ago just as a quick example of how many birds just within a few minutes were seen and heard.

A large area of the proposed site has been good agricultural land for many years and is now being taken out of food production, it makes no sense, we need food as much as green energy specially when we were told by a Neso representative who came to a meeting with our local MP that we already have enough solar and battery sites with permissions granted in our area, (T5) so really Rosefield is not needed to meet with the Governments 2030 Net Zero targets. Rosefield can't possibly have any connection date to the East Claydon substation as the substation has not even put in for consultation on planning. The East Claydon Sub station is delayed. How can this project be granted permission with no connection?

Life driving around the local area is stressful enough with all the HS2, ESW traffic and road closures, this really is getting people down, we are mentally exhausted with fighting for our countryside.

I do not understand why you would put solar panels on the side of the hill to be seen for miles around, The views from the historic Quainton Hill will be ruined for ever. every time you walk, drive ride or cycle in one of the only relatively unspoilt areas of Bucks will be industrialised and never the same again. we are always told how green space is good for our mental wellbeing, is this country determined to depress people who chose to live in the countryside. Please do not let them be built on the hillside.

Battery storage is another big concern over fire safety and thermal run off especially near homes, a children's farm and in rural areas with limited resources.

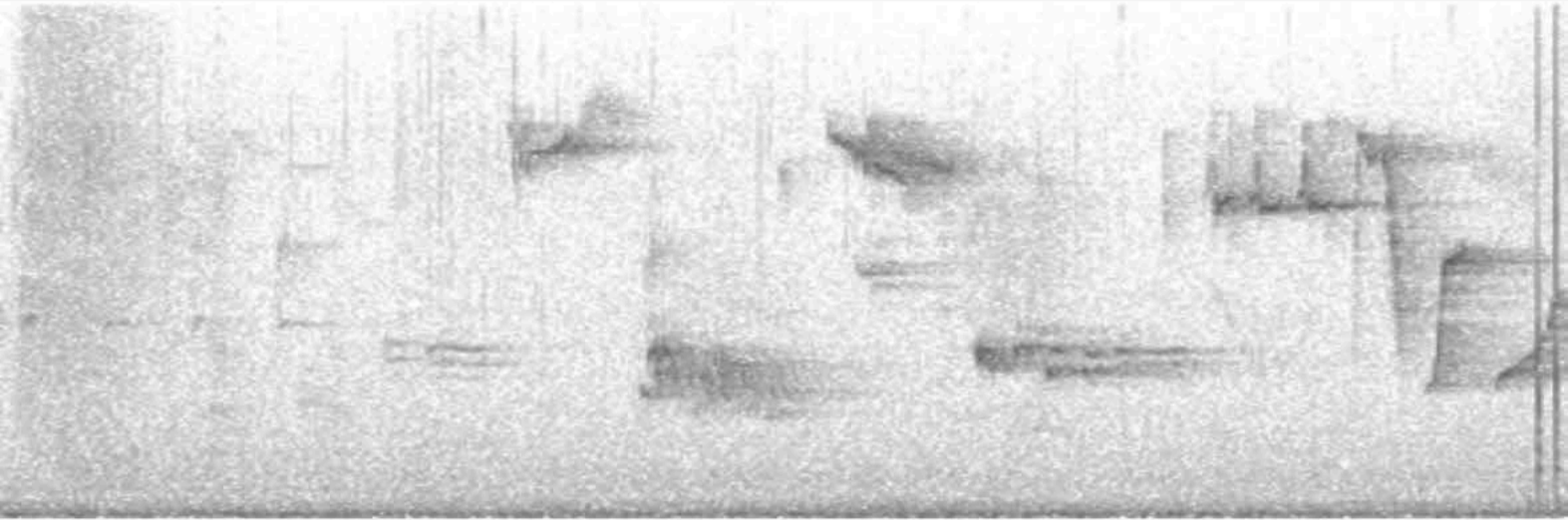
