The Examining Authority (ExA) is writing to request further information from all parties under Rule 17 of the Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010 (as amended).

Can all parties please advise the ExA if artificial intelligence (AI) has been used in any of your submissions to date.

The Planning Inspectorate issued revised guidance on the use of AI in February 2026 to aid the examination of proposals in a transparent manner. The attention of all parties was drawn to this revised guidance in the preliminary meeting and the ExA's rule 8 letter [PD-009].

The guidance requires you to inform the ExA about the use of AI, if you have used it to:

- draft or substantially rewrite text
- produce a summary or analysis
- generate or alter images or videos
- create content that goes beyond straightforward formatting or presentation

At this stage, in response to this request and going forward, you only need to provide a short statement. This can be in your covering email, letter or included as part of your statement and/or proof of evidence.

Please briefly state:

- that AI was used
- which tool was used (e.g. CoPilot, chatGPT, midjourney or another application)

- what it was used for and how it was used, for example if it was used to draft an objection in general or a specific part of an objection, or if any images or videos have been generated or altered, say which parts have changed.
- what checks you made and that you take responsibility for the accuracy of the content
