

A visit by the inspectors to [REDACTED] would, in my opinion, be a good use of their time. From the top of Hogshaw Hill looking north there is an excellent and comprehensive birds-eye view of the whole of Rosefield's proposed development. If done early in the inspectors' programme of visits it would provide a good perspective for all the other visits.

Additionally, it would impress on the inspectors how damaging it would be for the many walkers, horseriders, and bikers who use this popular and ancient right of way. Although Hogshaw Hill is outside the proposed development area, it would be severely impacted by it.

And finally, on a fine day there are few better places to be to lift the spirits and enjoy this AAL (Area of Attractive Landscape which has been proposed for upgrading to an AONB [Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty]). I suggest the inspectors come by car up to [REDACTED] and then walk the short distance to the top of Hogshaw Hill. On a good day one can see into five counties. What a blight it would be if that view were to be spoiled by solar panels in the middle distance.
