

We would like to strongly object to this plan.

As per information below, why has a full and thorough road assessment not been undertaken? Our house access and that of a group of industrial units is on a blind bend. Only this morning I had a near miss when an HS2 lorry came around the bend on the wrong side of the road. Rediculous.

Our particular concerns surround road access. Claydon Road is narrow, a typical country road, with multiple blind bends. My farm is accessed via a narrow lane, as seen in the attached print from Google Maps. This lane is on a blind bend and there have already been multiple near misses as people come around way to quickly without a clear view of cars turning right. The lane is also an access way for multiple industrial units, so there is almost constant flow of cars turning from the main road. During times of delivery that are also lorries turning. Due to the narrowness of the road lorries, and larger vehicles are forced to go onto the wrong side of the road in order to successfully access Claydon Road. Our major concern is that with a massive increase of traffic along the Claydon Road, there will be a hugely increased risk of serious accident. We are extremely disappointed and frustrated that a full assessment hasn't been carried out. It seems to be a staggering oversight.
