# Statement of Community Consultation



# Introduction

One Earth Solar Farm Ltd is inviting feedback from the local community on its proposals for One Earth Solar Farm as part of a public consultation from 29 May - 9 July 2024.

One Earth Solar Farm is a proposed new solar farm with battery storage (the Project) that would help meet the country's need for low-carbon, homegrown energy. The Project is primarily located in Nottinghamshire and Lincolnshire and would connect into the National Grid at High Marnham substation. It is being brought forward by One Earth Solar Farm Limited, a joint venture between PS Renewables and Ørsted.

Because of its size, One Earth is considered a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP). The Planning Act 2008 and associated legislation and guidance set out the planning process for NSIPs. They require that we apply for a type of planning approval known as a Development Consent Order (DCO) to build and operate it. Unlike planning applications which are determined by local authorities, NSIPs are submitted to and decided at the national level by the relevant Secretary of State.

The Project is still in the early stages, and consultation is an important part of our development process. We want to hear the views of local residents, technical experts, and elected representatives to help inform the design of One Earth. This feedback will help us develop our plans responsibly, in a way that is sensitive to the local environment and community.

We have already completed our initial stage of consultation that took place from 27 September to 8 November 2023 on our early designs. Although this consultation was informal, the feedback we received is being taken into account to inform the project design as well as our approach to consultation, which is set out in this document.

We have prepared this document, known as a Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC), in accordance with Section 47 of the Planning Act 2008. It explains how we plan to consult with people living in the vicinity of the Project about our proposals. It will be published according to the requirements of the Planning Act, and includes:

- Information about One Earth and the companies behind it:
- An explanation of the planning process for One Earth including pre-application consultation and environmental assessments;
- Our approach to community consultation including who we will consult, when, how, and what about:
- How we will let people know about the consultation, provide information, and receive feedback; and,
- The next steps after consultation, including how we will have regard to the feedback we receive.

# **About Us**

The Project is being brought forward by One Earth Solar Farm Ltd, which is a joint venture between PS Renewables and Ørsted.

#### **PS** Renewables

Established in 2012, PS Renewables has rapidly become one of the UK's largest renewable energy development, construction, and operation companies. Alongside an existing solar farm portfolio totalling over 300MW, PS Renewables is one of the UK's largest developers of solar NSIPs, including Longfield Solar Farm, which received consent last year.



# **About One Earth**

One Earth Solar Farm is a proposed new solar farm with associated battery storage and infrastructure located primarily in Nottinghamshire that would help meet the country's need for low-carbon, homegrown energy.

Over the next three decades, the country needs to undergo a clean energy transformation to combat climate change and enhance energy security. We must change the way we power our homes and businesses, get around, and manage our resources, while boosting our supply of clean energy.

As we phase out older forms of power generation, such as the former coal-fired power station at High Marnham, new renewable energy sources must be developed to replace them. At the same time, we are relying more and more on electricity in our daily lives, as petrol cars and gas boilers are phased out, increasing demand for electricity.






# Components of a Solar Farm

#### The Project would include the following components:

- 1. Solar photovoltaic (PV) panels Groundmounted solar panels would collect energy from sunlight and turn it into electricity in the form of low voltage, direct current (DC).
- 2. On-site cabling Underground cables would connect the solar PV panels to other parts of the solar farm.
- 3. Solar stations These stations would prepare the electricity to connect to the grid. They would include an inverter to convert the electricity from direct current (DC) to alternating current (AC), and a transformer to 'step up' the voltage.
- 4. On-site substation Cables would bring electricity from across the site together at a substation, which would combine the power sources together and 'step up' the voltage again, so that the energy is ready to enter the National Grid.

- 5. Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) -
  - The primary purpose of the BESS would be to store the energy generated by the solar photovoltaic (PV) panels at times when it is not needed by the National Grid and then release it to the grid when it is needed most. Additionally, the BESS would also provide vital grid services by taking energy from the National Grid, storing it during periods of low demand (when it could otherwise be wasted) and releasing it to the National Grid when homes and businesses most need it.
- 6. Grid connection The electricity would enter the National Grid at the High Marnham substation, and then go on to power homes and businesses locally and nationwide.

# The Planning Process

Because One Earth would produce more than 50MW of energy, it is considered a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP).

The Planning Act 2008 and associated legislation and guidance set out the planning process for NSIPs and require that we apply for a Development Consent Order (DCO) to build and operate One Earth. Unlike planning applications which are determined by local authorities, NSIPs are submitted to and decided at the national level. We will submit our DCO application to the Planning Inspectorate (PINS), an independent body that administers the process of reviewing and examining the application on behalf of the Secretary of State. After examination, the Examining Authority will make a recommendation about whether or not to approve the Project, but the final decision will be made by the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net-Zero.

#### **Pre-Application Consultation**

Consultation is an important part of the DCO Process.

Before we submit our DCO application, the Planning
Act 2008 requires us to consult on our proposals.

For One Earth, we will consult early and often, throughout the project's development, to ensure valuable local knowledge is built into our proposals. Under sections
42 and 47 of the Planning Act 2008, we must consult with:

- Local authorities and parish councils in which the Project is located or which neighbour the local authorities and parish councils that are hosting the Project;
- Persons that have an interest in the land affected by the Project, including landowners, occupants and tenants;
- Certain organisations and technical bodies (like Historic England and the Environment Agency) which have been prescribed by the Planning Act 2008; and,
- The local community.

#### **Consultation and the Design Process**

The design process for One Earth is iterative, which means that there will be several versions of the design as the project develops. Feedback from consultations and results of environmental assessments will inform our evolving proposals at each stage. We have carried out one stage of non-statutory consultation already and anticipate at least one further round of consultation:

- Non-Statutory Consultation: 27 September -8 November 2023 - This first consultation was on our initial proposals for One Earth.
- 2. Statutory Consultation: 29 May 9 July 2024 -

The second consultation will be on our revised proposals, which have been updated based on feedback from the first consultation and ongoing environmental assessments. This is a 'statutory consultation', subject to the approach described in this document and the requirements of the Planning Act 2008 and associated guidance. Feedback from this consultation will inform the updated design we submit in the DCO application.

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#### **Environmental Impact Assessment**

Due to the size and nature of the Project, it is considered 'EIA Development'. This means that we will conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) which we will report on in an Environmental Statement in our DCO application. The EIA will assess the Project's potential effects on the environment in accordance with the requirements of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. If we identify any potential significant impacts, we will also explain how we propose to mitigate them.

#### **Scoping**

An applicant for a DCO can ask the Secretary of State for their opinion on the scope of the EIA and the level of detail to be presented in the EIA. One Earth Solar Farm Limited applied to the Secretary of State for a Scoping Opinion on 13 November 2023, and PINS subsequently provided the Scoping Opinion on behalf of the Secretary of State on 22 December 2023. The Scoping Opinion will now be used to guide how we will complete our EIA. You can find it on the PINS website (scan QR code to see).

#### **Preliminary Environmental Information Report**

We are required to prepare a 'Preliminary Environmental Information Report' or 'PEIR' which will be published as part of the statutory consultation. The PEIR must include the information which is reasonably required for consultation bodies to develop an informed view of the likely significant environmental effects of the Project.

#### **DCO Application**


Our DCO application will include the Environmental Statement and a Consultation Report that sets out the consultation we have undertaken as part of the pre-application process. In the Consultation Report we will explain how we have had regard to the consultation feedback we have received. It will also explain if we have made changes to the Project design as a result of consultation responses received.

Together, the feedback from consultations and results of environmental assessments will help refine our proposals for One Earth.





# Our Approach to Community Consultation

We aim to ensure that anyone who wants to engage in the consultation is able to do so, by providing a variety of ways people can learn about the proposals and provide their feedback.

We have developed the approach set out in this document taking into account what has worked well in previous round of consultation, feedback from local authorities, and best practice. We have also considered requirements included in the Planning Act 2008, EIA regulations, associated guidance and PINS advice notes.

We will structure our consultation with accessibility at its heart, making sure it is as easy as possible to take part. This means providing materials both in print and online, using easy to understand, non-technical language and providing alternative formats if requested. We will schedule events for the community to learn about our proposals in locally convenient locations at various days of the week and times of day to accommodate different work/life schedules, as well as provide both in-person and virtual options to attend. We will also reach out to gateway organisations for hard-to-reach groups, so that we can hear from as many voices as possible.

#### **Non-Statutory Consultation**

During our first consultation held over six weeks in Autumn 2023, we presented our early designs for One Earth. We held in-person and online events to present information about One Earth, in addition to providing materials through our website and in hard copy. We asked for feedback on the proposed development as well as our consultation approach, which has helped inform our next phase of consultation. Feedback included requests for additional visualisations and project details, which we will provide at the statutory consultation.

#### **Feedback from Local Authorities**

Our approach to consultation has been informed by feedback from local authorities, to ensure that we are utilising local knowledge to inform an effective consultation process. From 5 April to 4 May 2024, we consulted with the host local authorities on our proposed approach to the next stage of consultation, as laid out in this document. Our strategy has been updated to include their feedback including extending events into evening hours, adding an additional community access location, and providing a second webinar.

# What are we consulting on?

During our statutory consultation from 29 May - 9 July 2024, we will present our updated proposals and ask for your feedback.

During the statutory consultation, we will be asking for your views on:

- Our proposals for One Earth Solar Farm as a whole;
- The location of the Project's components, including the solar panels, substations, and batteries;
- The PEIR and potential impacts from the Project during construction, operation, and decommissioning to the local environment and community;
- Our proposals for mitigating the potential impacts and environmental enhancements;
- Potential benefits that the Project could include for the local environment and the community; and,
- Anything else that you think we need to consider.




# Who are we consulting?

We want to consult widely with anyone who has an interest in or feels impacted by One Earth Solar Farm. We have identified a variety of stakeholders that we believe may have an interest the Project, and developed a plan to notify these groups and individuals - but anyone is welcome to submit their feedback.

#### Zone 1: Core Consultation Zone

We have identified an area that includes around 1,500 addresses by drawing a shape 2km from the Project's boundaries, and then expanding further to ensure entire communities were included. Being in close proximity to the proposed development, this zone was selected as the group of homes and businesses that would have the greater interest in the Project.



# Zone 2: Additional members of the community, groups, and elected officials

We recognise that there may be other individuals and organisations that work, visit, or have an interest in the Project location but do not live within the core consultation zone. We have identified organisations and community groups that serve the broader community, including organisations that support seldom heard groups. We have also identified elected officials from the host regions where the Project would be located.

# After the Statutory Consultation

Once the consultation has concluded, we will review the feedback we have received.

Any comments received will be analysed by One Earth Solar Farm Ltd and any of its appointed agents. Copies may be made available in due course to the Secretary of State, the Planning Inspectorate and other relevant statutory authorities so that feedback can be considered as part of the DCO process. We will request that any personal details are not placed on public record and will be held securely by One Earth Solar Farm Ltd and its agents in accordance with the data protection law and will be used solely in connection with the consultation process and subsequent DCO application and, except as noted above, will not be passed to third parties.

All feedback will be considered alongside the ongoing environmental assessments to help inform the updated design that will be submitted in the DCO application. As required by the Planning Act 2008, Within the DCO application, we will include a Consultation Report that shows how we have had due regard to all consultation feedback, as well as how we complied with the approach to consultation set out in this document.

#### **Ongoing Engagement**

Our communications channels will remain open throughout the pre-application process to answer any questions from the community. Individuals can opt-in through the project website or consultation questionnaire if they would like to receive project updates. We will provide a community update newsletter after the consultation has ended to describe the project's next steps. If there are any significant changes to the project, we may be required to host a targeted consultation on the project changes. In that case, we would notify the community in line with the requirements of the Planning Act 2008, PINS guidance, and the approach described in this document.



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


One Earth would use ground-mounted solar photovoltaic (PV) panels to generate electricity from the sun. The project includes a Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) to improve the efficiency of the solar panels by storing the solar energy and releasing it to the grid when it is needed most. We have secured a grid connection agreement which allows us to import and export up to 740MW of electricity to and from the National Grid which is enough low-carbon electricity to supply more than 200,000 UK homes.

One Earth Solar Farm would be located across approximately 1,600 hectares (3,950 acres) of land located primarily in Nottinghamshire. The starting point for choosing the location of the solar farm was the availability of the grid connection point at High Marnham. When the old coal-fired power station was decommissioned, it created capacity at this location for new energy projects to come online.





#### **DCO** Application

One Earth is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP), because it would produce more than 50MW of energy. The Planning Act 2008 sets out the planning process for NSIPs and requires that we apply for a Development Consent Order (DCO) to build, operate and decommission One Earth.

Unlike planning applications which are determined by local authorities, NSIPs are submitted to and decided at the national level. We will submit our DCO application to the Planning Inspectorate (PINS), an independent body that administers the process of reviewing and examining the DCO application on behalf of the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero (Secretary of State). An Examining Authority will be

Zero (Secretary of State). An Examining Authority will be appointed to review and examine the DCO application. After examination, the Examining Authority will make a recommendation about whether to approve the project, before a final decision is made by the Secretary of State.

#### Pre-application Consultation

An important part of the development of an NSIP is consultation before the DCO application is submitted. This ensures that local knowledge is built into the project design at an early stage of development. We held a first stage of consultation in Autumn 2023. We considered the feedback from that consultation alongside the results of ongoing environmental assessments to inform an updated project design. We are presenting our updated design for the second consultation, which is now underway. This feedback will help






