

As my home is one of the most affected properties by this application, I am reiterating my previous comments that this proposition should not be allowed to go ahead.

One Earth has made too many errors and omissions from the start of their application. They have shown no interest in the well being, the thoughts and opinions of the residents, or answered any of the questions raised.

When Mr Maund visited our property on 2 September 2025 we were alarmed to also see around seven One Earth representatives accompanying him. We thought this was a conflict of interest, as Mr Maund should have been allowed to make his own judgement on the situation without their interference.

As it is planned that the fields surrounding the sides and rear of our property are to be filled with panels, the views from the rear of our home and garden which we have enjoyed for the last 37 years will be completely ruined due to their proximity. Also, due to the proposed height of said panels, we will feel totally enclosed and intimidated.

As the field nearest to our property floods during the wetter months even after it has been cultivated, I am worried that if the ground around the panels is compacted this will result in a higher flood risk and will have a greater impact on our property and garden.

If this application is agreed, our property will be worthless should we choose to move in the future.

In our 37 years we have seen these fields used for sheep and cattle grazing, and various types of crops grown, including wheat, potatoes, onions, beetroot, carrots, sugar beet etc etc. Surely this is the correct use of this land and not for the installation of solar panels.
