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# 1 INTRODUCTION

## 1.1 PURPOSE OF THIS DOCUMENT

- 1 This document provides a guide (Guide) to the application for a Development Consent Order (DCO) for Great North Road Solar and Biodiversity Park. The Application is for a Development Consent Order (DCO) for the construction, operation and maintenance, and decommissioning of Great North Road Solar and Biodiversity Park (GNR), a proposed solar photovoltaic (PV) electricity generating facility and electrical storage facility with a total capacity exceeding 50 megawatts (MW) and an export connection to the National Grid (hereafter referred to as “the Development”). Therefore, the Development is classified as a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) under the Planning Act 2008. A full development description has been provided in Chapter 5 – Development Description [EN010162/APP/6.2.5].
- 2 The Application is made by Elements Green Trent Limited (the Applicant) to the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero (‘the Secretary of State’) under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 (PA 2008).
- 3 The Application is required because the photo-voltaic generating station is classified as a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) under the PA 2008, and the accompanying energy storage system and electrical substations qualify as associated development under section 115 of the Planning Act 2008 (PA 2008).
- 4 This Guide aims to help the Examining Authority (ExA) and Interested Parties understand the Application through signposting to the documents that make up the Application. This Guide is an iterative document that will be updated as part of the Applicant’s submission for each Examination deadline, both to capture the latest versions of updated documents and to record new documents submitted as part of the Examination.
- 5 Regulation 5 of the Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009 (as amended) (‘the APFP Regulations’)) sets out the documents that all DCO applications must include. It also provides in Regulation 5(2)(q) for the submission of ‘*any other documents considered necessary to support the application*’ as well as at Regulation 5(2)(o) for ‘*any other plans, drawings and sections necessary to describe the proposals*’.
- 6 Regulation 6 of the APFP Regulations sets out the specific documentation required in support of DCO applications for particular types of development, including generating stations and grid connections. This document provides a full list of documents prepared to meet the requirements of Regulations 5 and 6.
- 7 The Development comprises EIA development as defined in the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 (‘the EIA Regulations’) and is therefore supported by an environmental

statement, following consultation on preliminary environmental information prior to the submission of the Application.

- 8 This Guide provides an overview of the documents that have been submitted in order to satisfy the APFP Regulations, the EIA Regulations and section 37 of the PA 2008

## **1.2 THE APPLICANT**

- 9 The Application has been prepared by RPS on behalf of the Applicant, Elements Green Trent Limited, who are a licence holder under the Electricity Act 1989 and is a company registered in England and Wales (company no. 13665771).

## **2 THE DEVELOPMENT**

### **2.1 DEVELOPMENT DESCRIPTION**

- 10 The Development comprises of the construction, operation and maintenance and decommissioning of Great North Road Solar and Biodiversity Park; a proposed solar photovoltaic (PV) electricity generating facility and electrical storage facility with a total capacity exceeding 50 megawatts (MW) and an export connection to the National Grid. The total area of the Development Site is approximately 1,765 hectares (ha). Intermediary substations and a Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) are included as part of the Development. The BESS provides stabilisation in the supply of energy to maximise efficiency. Chapter 5– Development Description of the Environmental Statement ('ES') [EN010162/APP/6.2.5]. provides a detailed description of the existing Development Site, the physical characteristics of the Development and the proposed programme of site preparation, construction and decommissioning Site Location and the Order Limits
- 11 The Development would be located to the northwest of Newark, in Newark and Sherwood district, Nottinghamshire, East Midlands. The Development would be within an area bound by the Order Limits. The Order Limits are to the west of the A1, north of the A617, east of Eakring, and south of Egmanton, occupying two main areas to the north and north-west of Staythorpe. The Order Limits are shown on Figure 1.1: Development Location [EN010162/APP/6.3.1.1].

### **2.2 SUMMARY**

- 12 The documents submitted as part of the Application have been grouped into Volumes as detailed below. A plain English summary of the documents is

A Non-Technical Summary of the ES is also provided.

- 17 It is anticipated that further documents and supporting information will be submitted during the Examination stage of the DCO Application. These will be contained in a further Volume 8, accompanied by an updated Guide to

set out details of these documents, submitted during the Examination as required.

- 21 The Guide to the Application is this document [EN010162/APP/1.4]. The Navigation Document is included as Appendix A to this document and contains a list of electronic file names, document reference numbers and regulation numbers for all documents provided in each volume.
- 22 The Pre-Application Programme document [EN010162/APP/1.5] outlines the pre-application activities, including consultation processes, stakeholder engagement, environmental assessments, and risks associated with the project. - 25 The Draft Development Consent Order [EN010162/APP/3.1] is the draft statutory instrument which contains the legal powers that the Applicant is seeking to enable it to construct, operate (including maintenance), and decommission the Development should consent be granted. It sets out the parameters for what development would be permitted.
- 26 The Explanatory Memorandum [EN010162/APP/3.3] explains the purpose and effect of each provision in the draft DCO including why it is considered necessary. It also identifies examples of precedents from other DCOs where applicable.
- 27 Volume 3 also includes the Stationary Office (TSO) Validation Confirmation [EN010162/APP/3.2]



## **6 VOLUME 4. COMPULSORY PURCHASE INFORMATION**

- 28 The Statement of Reasons [EN010162/APP/4.1] and its appendices [EN010162/APP/4.1-3] explains that there is a compelling case in the public interest that would justify the Applicant's exercise of powers of compulsory acquisition in order to acquire land and rights permanently and to use land temporarily to enable it to construct, operate (including maintenance) and decommission the Development.
- 29 The Funding Statement [EN010162/APP/4.2] details how the Development, including any compulsory purchase acquisition, would be funded.
- 30 The Book of Reference [EN010162/APP/4.3] and Pre-application Land and Rights Negotiations Tracker [EN010162/APP/4.4] identifies all the parties who own or occupy land and/or have an interest in or right over the land affected by the Development, and/or who may be entitled to make a 'relevant claim' as defined in Section 57 of the PA 2008. It is structured in accordance with the regulatory requirements.
