Water Bodies in a River Basin Management Plan (Doc 2.6), Environmental Statement figure 9.4 (Doc 6.3.9.4), ES figure 9.6 (Doc 6.3.9.6), Figures within the Flood Risk Assessment (Doc 6.4.9.1) and Water Framework Directive Assessment (Doc 6.4.9.2)

The applicant is advised to review these figures for clarity and Noted. The figures within the management plans and ES consistency. The figures present varying levels of detail, geographic extent and sub sections/ catchments, waterbody naming and waterbody routes. The Inspectorate advises that the figures should show a consistent presentation of data. The figures should also show, where relevant, the extent of main rivers and ordinary watercourses.

figures have been updated to improve symbology and labelling for watercourses and to revise scale for clarity. This is to ensure a consistent presentation of the rivers/watercourses on the plans. The revised documents are listed below:

Figures within the Flood Risk Assessment (FRA) and Water Framework Directive Assessment (WFD) have been extracted as an appendix of each of the assessment for improved clarity.

Statutory and non-statutory features of Historic Environment Plan (Doc 2.15)

The applicant is advised to review these figures for clarity, specifically relating to the following points:

- due to the scale of the icons used and similar colouring, it is difficult to differentiate between Historic Environment Record (HER) assets and listed buildings/ grades
- a very similar colouring scheme between HER recorded 'undated' period and scheduled monuments keys has been used
- due to the small scale of the icons, the labelling sometimes obscures the record being shown.

An updated **Statutory and non-statutory features of Historic Environment Plan [EN010162/APP/2.15A]** has been submitted. The icons used on the plans have been updated to be clearer, along with a clearer differentiation between the colours used, and a clearer basemap.

Environmental Statement (ES), Chapter 7, figures 6.3.7.11.1 – 6.3.7.11.55)

The Landscape and Visual Impact Assessment (LVIA) contained within the ES, Chapter 7 details the analysis undertaken for 55 viewpoints from the visualisations contained within figures 6.3.7.11.1 – 6.3.7.11.55. The

technical appendix detailing the methodology also refers to photomontages and wireline modelling where required. However, the visualisations and photomontages do not appear to have been provided, as figures 6.3.7.11.1 – 6.3.7.11.55 contain only the location plan of the viewpoint as well as its description. We request that the applicant provide these visualisations and photomontages ahead of the opening of the relevant representation period.

updated ES Volume 3, Figure 7.11: Visualisation Viewpoints [EN010162/APP/ 6.3.7.11A]

Flood Risk Assessment (Doc 6.4.9.1)

The Flood Risk Assessment (FRA) provides limited explanation of the rationale behind the methodology chosen and the level of agreement with the relevant statutory consultees, in particular the Environment Agency and the Lead Local Flood Authority. This information is however available in part in accompanying documents such as the consultation report.

The applicant is advised to consolidate the information provided on the consultation undertaken and position of agreement with relevant consultees, in particular in relation to the methodology that has been utilised, into an updated FRA. This is of particular relevance to the assessment of waterbodies that are described or represented as tributaries of the Trent but do not appear to have either project specific modelling or reference to existing published studies (for example "The Beck" waterbody which appears to have an associated flood zone 2/ 3 but does not appear to be specifically referred to in the FRA).

Given the geographic scale of the proposed development, the FRA utilises multiple different baseline datasets/ published flood modelling for the differing waterbodies that are required

An updated **ES Volume 4, Appendix 9.1: Flood Risk Assessment [EN010162/APP/6.4.9.1A]** has been submitted to provide further explanation of the rationale behind the methodology chosen and the level of agreement with the relevant statutory consultees, including the Environment Agency (EA) and Nottinghamshire County Council (as the Lead Local Flood Authority).

The updated FRA also provides updates in relation to the following:

- Appendix X has been created to consolidate the feedback from relevant statutory consultees and how the Applicant has responded to that feedback in the preparation of the FRA.
- Appendix [D] has been created to present the FRA figures.
- Figure A9.12 has been updated to show the catchment areas of each flood study referred to in the FRA (See section A9.1.1.11 of the FRA).
- A representation of all watercourses flooding at the same time and the peak extent is provided in Figure A9.1 of the FRA. The Applicant notes that watercourses that interact

to be included in the FRA, as well as more targeted site specific modelling (pluvial flood risk and River Greet). However, with reference to the point above on ensuring a clear explanation of the methodology and the specific water bodies included for the benefit of interested parties, the applicant is advised to provide a figure or other explanation as to the relevant geographic areas covered by each of the datasets used in the assessment, the area covered by any site specific modelling, and whether these waterbodies are main river or ordinary watercourses. At present, the FRA relies on insets/ partial figures from the relevant studies and modelling. From the various figures provided with the application, the waterbodies adjacent to or within the order limits appear to be (however the applicant is advised to include all relevant waterbodies):

- River Trent (towards the East)
- The Beck (tributary of the Trent) (West and central)
- Pingley/ Rundell Dyke/ Car Dyke (South)
- Moorhouse Beck (tributary of Goosemoor Dyke) (north)
- Goosemoor Dyke (North)
- The Wink (Southwest)

The FRA should also explain whether there are any increases in flood levels should the waterbodies assessed flood at the same time, as currently these appear to be predominately assessed by individual modelling or use of published studies.

The FRA should also provide the full results of the project specific modelling undertaken, as these are not currently included in full.

with the Order limits are not close enough to be influenced by other watercourses during a flood event. The Applicant notes that the River Trent is not a rapid response catchment due to the wide area which it drains. This means that the tributaries of the River Trent within and close to the Order Limits will transfer water downstream more rapidly than the River Trent. This further limits it's influence on water levels. Structures, such as the A1, East Coast Mainline Railway embankments and culverts / bridges also limit the influence and flood extent of the River Trent.

 The FRA has been updated to include the full results of the project specific modelling that has been undertaken and are presented in Table A9.1.4 of the FRA.



Book of Reference (Doc 4.3)

When cross referencing the Book of Reference (BoR) with the The Applicant has reviewed the **Book of Reference** applicant's list of statutory consultees some inconsistencies have been identified. There are a number of names included in the BoR which do not either appear on the s44 consultee list within the Consultation Report (Doc 5.1) or they have had a possible name change.

Please can an updated BoR be submitted in the early preexamination period to ensure that the Planning Inspectorate is able to formally notify all affected parties of the preliminary meeting and draft examination timetable.

It has been crosschecked against the S.44 Consultee list within the Consultation Report [EN010162/APP/5.1] [APP-296]. The updated Book of Reference [EN010162/APP/4.3A] has been included within this submission.

Land Rights and Negotiations Tracker (Doc 4.4)

No statuses for negotiations have been provided for Refs. 62, 63, and 64. The table may also benefit from minor reformatting so that numbers and figures which are close to borders are more legible.

The tracker should be updated for these land parcels to show the different statuses for each land interest and re-formatted before the commencement of the preliminary meeting.

Noted. The Applicant has reviewed the Land Rights and Negotiations Tracker [EN010162/APP/4.4] [APP-016] and can confirm that the status for references 62, 63 and 64 should be 'Amber (Agreement expected to be reached before the end of the Examination')' for each of the three entries. As requested, the document will also be updated and submitted to PINS in advance of the Preliminary Meeting to include the change noted above and to show the current status of negotiation for each relevant land parcel.

Minor errors and omissions

There are minor errors and omissions, as reflected in Box 30 of the acceptance checklist.

Aside from submitting the visualisations and photomontages requested in this letter before the commencement of the relevant representation period, and submitting an updated

The applicant's Consultation Report (Doc ref 5.1) does not appear to show if these bodies identified above have been consulted. However, it is noted that the licences held by these bodies cover Great Britain or various smaller areas and the operational areas of each are not clear from information in the public domain. One of the bodies listed above (RWE Generation UK Plc) has been identified by the applicant as having an interest in the order land and are listed in the Book of Reference (Doc 4.3) under category 2 and was consulted under s44.

Box 30 of the S55 Checklist: Other Observations

Land Plans (Doc 2.2)

The language used in the legend to describe the various plots is not consistent with what is described in the Book of Reference (BoR). A consistent approach should be utilised across the plans/ BoR/ Development Consent Order/ Statement of Reasons to improve clarity.

- The cutlines on sheet 2 are incorrectly labelled and refer the reader to 'sheet 2'.
- There are a number of blue coloured plots that are not labelled. These are adjacent to 2/28, 2/24 and 2/38 on sheet 2.
- An inset box may be beneficial for the area plot surrounding 2/38 (sheet 2) as the plot numbers are unclear.
- A pink coloured plot adjacent to plot 19/21 (sheet 19) appears unlabelled. It might be part of plot 19/7 but this is unclear.
- Labels 29/4 and 29/3 on sheet 29 point to the same plot.

The updated **Land Plans [EN010162/APP/2.2A]** have been updated to action this advice.

The blue coloured plots on sheet 2 are now labelled. Additional insets have been added to sheet 2, alongside with the updated cutline labels.

Additional label has been added to plot 19/7 on sheet 19 to improve clarity.

The labels on sheet 29 have also been updated, including labels 29/4 and 29/3.



Works Plans (Doc 2.3)

• The works numbers are listed in the legend. For improved clarity and comprehension please label each work number plot on each sheet.

The updated **Works Plans [EN010162/APP/2.3A]** have been updated to clarify the labelling of Work Numbers on each sheet.

Streets & Access Plans (Doc 2.8)

- Not all roads are labelled on the plans, even those identified in the dDCO. For improved clarity and comprehension please revise.
- Throughout the plans there are small pink lines with dots on each end. These should be labelled/ identified in the legend for clarity.
- On sheets 3 & 5, SW-13 appears to be on Coldharbour Lane but the dDCO identifies SW-13 as on Broadgate Lane.

The **Streets and Access Plans [EN010162/APP/2.8A]** have been updated to include labels for all roads and adjust the legend to improve clarity and consistency. The basemap has been updated to remove pink lines/dots.

Reference SW-13 Coldharbour Lane has been confirmed as correct and the corresponding reference in the Schedule 3 of the **Draft Development Consent Order** [EN010162/APP/3.1A] on page 45 has been corrected from Broadgate Lane to Coldharbour Lane.

Document naming

• There were several instances of document file names differing to the name of the document on the title page. For example, Figure 10.2 Ground Conditions Constraint Plan is also 10.2 Contaminated Land Constraints Plan.
