Um, the development is anticipated to to have a generation capacity of 800MW AC by 2028, which is critical for the clean power delivery for 2030. And just for context, to reach the 2030 targets, six gigawatts per year for the next five years are required.

So in this context, the development brings a significant benefit in respect of both clean power but also net zero. Um.
