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1. Introduction

1.1 Overview

- 1.1.1 This **Statement of Commonality for all Statements of Common Ground (EN010166/APP/8.18)** relates to an application (the 'Application') made by Uniper UK Limited (the Applicant), to the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero for a Development Consent Order (DCO) under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 (PA 2008) for the Connah's Quay Low Carbon Project.
- 1.1.2 The Application has been accepted for examination which commenced on 13 January 2026.
- 1.1.3 The Examining Authority's (ExA) Rule 6 letter (Annex D, page D2) dated 9 December 2025 confirms that the Applicant should prepare a Statement of Commonality (SoC) for the Statements of Common Ground (SoCG) being prepared by the Applicant with Interested Parties and submit a first draft of this at Deadline 1 (27 January 2026) of the Examination. The SoC will be updated for the subsequent examination deadlines.

1.2 Purpose of this Report

- 1.2.1 The purpose of the SoC is to provide the ExA with the current position on the SoCG between the Applicant and Interested Parties throughout the Examination.
- 1.2.2 The SoC structured as follows:
- Section 2 – lists the SoCG parties and the status of each SoCG.
 - Section 3 – identifies the main topics covered by the SoCG and where there is commonality in the topics between the SoCG parties.

2. List of SoCG Parties and the Status of SoCG

- 2.1.1 The Applicant has prepared initial draft SoCG with a number of Interested Parties. These SoCG will be developed further during the Examination.
- 2.1.2 Each SoCG sets out the matters relevant to the parties and whether these matters are agreed, still under discussion or not agreed, in addition to any remaining actions.
- 2.1.3 **Table 2-1** below lists the SoCG parties and provides information on the current status of the SoCG. The status categories for SoCG that will be used through the Examination are as follows:
- **Initial** – the SoCG has been issued to the relevant party, though no comments have been received in response yet.
 - **Draft** – comments have been received from the relevant party, but there are still matters to resolved before the document can be agreed and finalised.
 - **Final** – the SoCG has been reviewed and agreed between the parties but not signed.
 - **Signed** – the SoCG has been signed by both parties.
