1 Approach to consultation – 14 May 2025

Lime Down Solar Park: Targeted consultation on proposed changes

1. Introduction

1.1. This document explains further targeted consultation that will be undertaken on Lime Down Solar Park prior to a Development Consent Order (DCO) application being submitted to the Planning Inspectorate. The document describes the purpose and method of this further targeted consultation, and how it relates to the pre-application consultation already undertaken.

2. Approach to pre-application consultation

- 2.1. Lime Down Solar Park Ltd ('the Applicant') is proposing a new solar and energy storage project on land in Wiltshire, with associated infrastructure to connect it to the national grid. This solar park is known as Lime Down Solar Park (or the 'Project').
- 2.2. As described in the Project's <u>Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC)</u>, the Applicant recognises consultation to be a vital stage in the development of proposals. Feedback received through consultation is informing the refinement of plans for the Project, helping the proposals to be developed responsibly and in a manner that recognises local community and stakeholder interests.
- 2.3. The published SoCC outlines how the Applicant will consult with the local community during the 'pre-application stage' before submitting a DCO application for the Project to the Planning Inspectorate.
- 2.4. The SoCC was published on 14 January 2025, following consultation on a draft version of the document with Wiltshire Council LPA. An Errata Statement to the SoCC was published on 27 January 2025 to correct an error identified in Figure 3 Core Consultation Zone and Appendix 2, relating to the boundary for the core consultation zone.

3. Pre-application consultation already undertaken

- 3.1. The aim of the pre-application public consultation is to ensure that both the community and technical consultees have had meaningful opportunities to understand and influence the proposals for the Project.
- 3.2. The Applicant is undertaking an iterative consultation process. To date, community consultation on the proposals for the Project has consisted of two stages, including:
 - A non-statutory Stage One community consultation, lasting just over six weeks (43 days) from 14 March to 26 April 2024. This initial phase of consultation introduced the Project location and capacity and invited comments on early-stage proposals for the development. This included

the vision for the Project, the location of infrastructure and broad route corridors for underground cabling, environmental assessments undertaken to take, community benefits and considerations for the next stage of consultation.

- A Stage Two Statutory Consultation, lasting just over seven weeks (49 days), from 29 January to 19 March 2025. This phase of consultation included presenting more detailed proposals for the Project, which had regard to the comments received during Stage One consultation and ongoing assessment work. This Statutory Consultation was undertaken in compliance with requirements of the Planning Act 2008 (the "2008 Act"), associated regulations including the Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009 (the "APFP Regs 2009") and the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 (the "EIA Regs 2017"), as well as associated guidance.
- 3.3. Both stages of consultation were coordinated to provide information and invite feedback on the Project. The start of the Statutory Consultation period was aligned with the publication of the Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR), and feedback was invited from communities, landowners, and technical and prescribed organisations in parallel.

4. Objective of targeted consultation

- 4.1. Following the close of the statutory Stage Two Statutory Consultation, the Project team has continued to refine the proposals for the Project, in preparation for submitting the DCO application to the Planning Inspectorate.
- 4.2. This progression has been informed by further design work and due diligence, ongoing consideration of consultee feedback, and findings from the environmental impact assessment.
- 4.3. This has resulted in a series of minor amendments to the development boundary area for the Project, compared to the boundary presented in the PEIR and for Stage Two Statutory Consultation. The changes comprise:
 - Six areas to enable the temporary highway and traffic works that would be required to safely accommodate the Abnormal Indivisible Load (AIL) vehicles needed during the construction phase of the Project.
 - Nine areas where the proposed development boundary area has been adjusted to avoid constraints such as woodland and hedgerows.
- 4.4. Although these changes are minor in nature and scale, the Applicant is committed to ensuring that relevant stakeholders are consulted on the changes prior to the DCO application being submitted.
- 4.5. The Applicant is therefore preparing to undertake a further targeted consultation on the changes referred to above.

- 4.6. Through the targeted consultation materials, the Applicant will clearly present each of these changes and explain any updates to the reporting of likely significant environmental effects.
- 4.7. Provision for further consultation on targeted changes such as this was described in the published SoCC (Section 10, Paragraph 10.7, Page 33):
 - "If, as a result of feedback, our proposals change to the extent we consider it necessary to undertake further targeted consultation, this will be undertaken, so far as relevant and proportionate, in accordance with the principles and methods set out in this SoCC."
- 4.8. Additionally, in determining how to consult on the localised changes we have had regard to paragraphs 020 of the 2008 Act Pre-application guidance for Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects setting out as follows:

"For any material change to a part of the proposed application where the project as a whole is not fundamentally changed, for example in the case of linear aspects where new information leads to a new alignment for a particular section of the proposal, a bespoke and targeted approach to further consultation can be adopted, which can address the specific consultation obligations arising proportionately.

Targeted consultation can be statutory or non-statutory or a combination of the two depending on whether new persons needing to be consulted under section 42 of the Planning Act have been identified, but such targeted consultation will not require the production of PEI provided proportionate and appropriate information on environmental implications of any changes, where necessary, is provided."

4.9. In line with this guidance and the Applicant's commitments as set out in the SoCC, the approach set out below is considered to be proportionate given the scale and nature of each localised change. A full re-consultation (in line with consultation under section 47 at Statutory Consultation) is therefore not proposed.

5. What will be consulted on

- 5.1. Consultation will be held on the proposed changes set out above.
- 5.2. These fifteen changes will be identified and numbered in the targeted consultation materials.
- 5.3. A visual of each change will be accompanied by an explanation of why the change is necessary for the Project. Any changes to the environmental impact assessment results presented at Stage Two Statutory Consultation will also be consulted on.

6. Who will be consulted

- 6.1. The targeted consultation will be carried out in accordance with relevant parts of the 2008 Act, the APFP Regs 2009 and the EIA Regs 2017.
- 6.2. The Applicant will proactively notify the following consultees:
 - All relevant prescribed consultees under section 42 of the 2008 Act will be notified and invited to respond.
 - As part of this, all host and neighbouring local authorities will be included in the consultation. This aligns with consultation under section 43 of the 2008 Act.
 - Any new land interests will be consulted. This aligns with consultation under section 44 of the 2008 Act.
 - Localised communities in the immediate vicinity of the changes (within a minimum distance of 200 metres of the relevant areas), will be notified and invited to respond. This aligns with consultation under the 2008 Act.
 - Parties representing the interests of these localised communities, including relevant ward members, Parish Councils, MPs, community groups and gateway organisations, will be notified. This aligns with consultation under the SoCC.
 - The Core Consultation Zone of over 14,000 properties will be informed of the targeted consultation as part of the Project Newsletter. This is consistent with the zone presented in the SoCC.
 - Any parties that have registered to be kept informed by email and by post.
 - Anyone interested in the proposals, and not included within the categories above, will also be able to respond to the consultation. They can participate in the consultation by accessing the Project website or free-to-use communications channels such as freephone and freepost.

7. How consultation will be undertaken

- 7.1. Consultation will be undertaken in a proportionate manner consistent with the principles and methods set out in the published SoCC, considering the specific details being consulted on.
- 7.2. The consultation period will exceed the statutory minimum of 28 days and is intended to be held between Tuesday 03 June and Friday 11 July 2025 (38 days).

7.3. This will involve:

- **Written notification** of the targeted consultation will be provided to consultees identified above.
- The targeted consultation materials will be made available on the Project website and offered to be provided in hard copy for inspection to the Community Access Points listed in the published SoCC (Corsham, Melksham, Chippenham and Malmesbury Libraries) as well as to additional locations in proximity to the changes (Chipping Sodbury Library, Yate Library).
- Printed copies of the targeted consultation materials will also be provided upon request. These materials include:

- o An **Information Change Note**, detailing each of the fifteen changes in line with the description provided in Section 5 of this document.
- Feedback will be invited through a Feedback form (available online via the Project website or hard copy at CAPs and upon request), by email, or in writing to the Freepost address.
- O By appointment with the Project team, it will be possible to make a verbal representation over the Project Freephone 0808 175 6656. Feedback provided will be transcribed and agreed verbally prior to submission. Appointments to provide verbal feedback should be made by contacting the Project team via the Project email address or telephone number described above.
- Updates to the Project website to provide information about the targeted consultation and changes being consulted on from 03 June 2025, including a dedicated webpage setting out details of the changes being consulted on (including maps).
- The dedicated Project free-to-use communications channels will remain open and staffed by members of the Community Relations team on weekdays between the hours of 9am to 5pm (excluding bank holidays).
- A press release released to local and regional media outlets to advise them of the targeted consultation, where information about what is consulted on can be found, and details of how views and comments can be submitted.
- 7.4. Printed communications will be issued on or around 28 May 2025 to allow the beginning of targeted consultation on 03 June 2025.

Lime Down Solar Park- Targeted Consultation

Section 42 of the Planning Act 2008 ('the 2008 Act'), Regulation 3 of the Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009 and Regulations 11 and 13 of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 ('the 2017 Regulations')

Notice publicising a proposed application for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") to construct, operate, maintain and decommission a solar photovoltaic (PV) generating station, with a generating capacity of more than 50 megawatts (MV) and associated infrastructure on land in Wiltshire (Lime Down Solar Park).

Notice is hereby given that Lime Down Solar Park Limited (Company registration number 13211532) of Unit 25.7 Coda Studios, 189 Munster Road, London, England SW6 6AW (the Applicant), proposes to apply to the Secretary of State (SoS) for Energy Security and Net Zero under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 for a Development Consent Order for the Lime Down Solar Park (the Application).

The Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR) published at Stage Two Statutory Consultation for Lime Down Solar Park (Project) identified a combined area of approximately 2,835 hectares as being required, comprising the following sites:

- Lime Down A, B, C, D, E: five solar array sites sites located in Wiltshire currently comprising 878
 hectares which lie to the north of the M4, southwest of Malmesbury, between the villages of
 Alderton, Luckington, Sherston, Foxley, Norton, Corston, Startley, Upper Seagry, Lower Stanton
 St Quintin and Hullavington.
- The solar array sites will include solar panels, conversion units, inverters, and up to five 33 kV substations located in Lime Down A to E and up to three 132 kV substations located in Lime Down A, C and E. There will be one 400 kV substation located within Lime Down D.
- One or two Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) areas, both of which will be located within Lime Down D.



- A cable route search area has been identified for the underground electricity cables connecting
 the Lime Down A to E solar array sites, substations, and the BESS to the national grid at the
 existing Melksham Substation, comprising an area of approximately 1,947 hectares.
- Associated infrastructure, mitigation and enhancement measures, and other ancillary works, for example, fencing, security, local grid connections, temporary access roads, permanent means of access, highway works, temporary works compounds and work sites.

At PEIR, Lime Down Solar Park was located entirely within the administrative boundary of Wiltshire Council. The Solar PV Sites are located across several parishes:

- Lime Down A is located within the civil parish of Sherston approximately 735 metres to the southeast of Sherston;
- Lime Down B is located within the civil parish of Norton approximately 3.9km to the west of Malmesbury;
- Lime Down C is located withing the civil parishes of Sherston, Luckington, Hullavington, and Norton approximately 3.3km to the south of Sherston;
- Lime Down D, which incorporate the proposed BESS areas, is located in the civil parishes of Norton and Hullavington approximately 4km to the southwest of Malmesbury; and
- Lime Down E is located within the civil parish of St Paul Malmesbury Without approximately 4.4km to the south of Malmesbury.

The proposed DCO will, among other things, authorise:

- Construction, operation, maintenance and decommissioning of the solar PV electricity generating station and associated development including grid connection and energy storage facility;
- Compulsory acquisition of land, including interests in land, rights over land and imposition of restrictions, powers to override, suspend or extinguish rights over land and powers for the temporary use of land;
- The application, modification and/or disapplication of legislation including legislation relating to compulsory purchase and landlord and tenant; and
- Such ancillary, incidental and consequential provisions, licenses, property rights, permits and consents as are necessary and/or convenient.

Lime Down Solar Park is an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) development for the purposes of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. This means that the proposed works constitute development for which an EIA is required and the proposed application for a DCO will therefore be accompanied by an Environmental Statement. The Environmental Statement will provide a detailed description of Lime Down Solar Park and its likely significant environmental effects. Information compiled so far about Lime Down Solar Park's likely significant environmental effects is set out for consultation in a Preliminary Environmental Information Report (the PEIR) and summarised in a Non-Technical Summary (NTS).



Targeted Consultation on Lime Down Solar Park

The Applicant is carrying out a further round of targeted consultation for the Project, focusing on fifteen specific changes, which have resulted in small increases to the development boundary area compared to the boundary presented in the PEIR for Stage Two Statutory Consultation. Each of the fifteen changes comprises an amendment to the development boundary area of between 0.03 ha and 0.69 ha, representing a total additional area of 3.24 ha since the PEIR.

Following the fifteen changes, Lime Down Solar Park is located predominantly within the administrative boundary of Wiltshire Council with two additional areas within the administrative area of South Gloucestershire. We are holding this round of consultation from **Tuesday 03 June until 23:59 on Friday 11 July 2025**. During this time, you have the opportunity to comment on these changes to the Project. We encourage you to submit any feedback you may have using the details provided at the end of this letter.

To summarise, the changes comprise:

- Six areas to enable the temporary highway and traffic works that would be required to safely accommodate the Abnormal Indivisible Load (AIL) vehicles needed during the construction phase of the Project.
- Nine areas where the proposed development boundary area has been adjusted to enable access to and within the Project site, and to avoid constraints such as woodland and hedgerows.

Although these changes are minor in nature and scale, we are committed to ensuring that relevant stakeholders are consulted on the changes prior to the DCO application being submitted.

We anticipate submitting our DCO application to the Planning Inspectorate on 19 September 2025. The DCO application will show any changes and refinements made in response to the feedback received during the Stage Two Statutory Consultation, as well as this phase of further targeted consultation.

We are writing to you as you have been identified as a consultee for the purpose of section 42(1)(d) of the 2008 Act as a person(s) with an interest in land affected by the proposed changes to the Project.

The proposed DCO will, among other things, authorise:

- Construction, operation, maintenance and decommissioning of the solar PV electricity generating station and associated development including grid connection and energy storage facility;
- Compulsory acquisition of land, including interests in land, rights over land and imposition of restrictions, powers to override, suspend or extinguish rights over land and powers for the temporary use of land;
- The application, modification and/or disapplication of legislation including legislation relating to compulsory purchase and landlord and tenant; and
- Such ancillary, incidental and consequential provisions, licenses, property rights, permits and consents as are necessary and/or convenient.

Lime Down Solar Park is an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) development for the purposes of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. This means that the proposed works constitute development for which an EIA is required and the proposed application for a DCO will therefore be accompanied by an Environmental Statement. The Environmental Statement will provide a detailed description of Lime Down Solar Park and its likely significant environmental effects. Information compiled so far about Lime Down Solar Park's likely significant environmental effects is set out for consultation in a Preliminary Environmental Information Report (the PEIR) and summarised in a Non-Technical Summary (NTS).



Targeted Consultation on Lime Down Solar Park

The Applicant is carrying out a further round of targeted consultation for the Project, focusing on fifteen specific changes, which have resulted in small increases to the development boundary area compared to the boundary presented in the PEIR for Stage Two Statutory Consultation. Each of the fifteen changes comprises an amendment to the development boundary area of between 0.03 ha and 0.69 ha, representing a total additional area of 3.24 ha since the PEIR.

Following the fifteen changes, Lime Down Solar Park is located predominantly within the administrative boundary of Wiltshire Council with two additional areas within the administrative area of South Gloucestershire. We are holding this round of consultation from **Tuesday 03 June until 23:59 on Friday 11 July 2025**. During this time, you have the opportunity to comment on these changes to the Project. We encourage you to submit any feedback you may have using the details provided at the end of this letter.

To summarise, the changes comprise:

- Six areas to enable the temporary highway and traffic works that would be required to safely accommodate the Abnormal Indivisible Load (AIL) vehicles needed during the construction phase of the Project.
- Nine areas where the proposed development boundary area has been adjusted to enable access to and within the Project site, and to avoid constraints such as woodland and hedgerows.

Although these changes are minor in nature and scale, we are committed to ensuring that relevant stakeholders are consulted on the changes prior to the DCO application being submitted.

We anticipate submitting our DCO application to the Planning Inspectorate on 19 September 2025. The DCO application will show any changes and refinements made in response to the feedback received during the Stage Two Statutory Consultation, as well as this phase of further targeted consultation.

We are writing to you as you have been identified as a consultee for the purpose of section 42(1)(d) of the 2008 Act as a person(s) with an interest in land affected by the proposed changes to the Project.

If you are a newly identified consultee and did not receive a letter as part of the statutory consultation, please refer to the enclosed section 48 notice We invite you to comment on the Stage Two Statutory Consultation materials, including the PEIR, as well as this targeted consultation.

Alternatively, we are contacting you as an existing consultee who has already been consulted at Stage Two Statutory Consultation but the land you have an interest in is also part of the proposed increases to the development boundary of the Project as a result of the changes described above. We invite you to comment on the targeted consultation.



This targeted consultation includes:

- Consultation with any persons with an interest in the land affected by the proposed changes (under section 42 and section 44 of the 2008 Act);
- Consultation with relevant prescribed bodies, host, and neighbouring authorities (under section 42 and section 43 of the 2008 Act); and
- Consultation with the local community in the vicinity of the proposed changes (within a minimum distance of 200 metres of the relevant areas). This aligns with consultation under the 2008 Act.

Hard copies of the PEIR, NTS and maps and plans from the statutory consultation remain available for inspection free of charge at two of the community venues listed below: Chippenham Library and Malmesbury Library. Details of these locations, how to request these documents and any related charges are set out in the enclosed section 48 notice that related to the statutory consultation.

Targeted consultation materials

The Applicant has published an Information Change Note on the proposed changes on the Project website for this targeted consultation. The document includes an overview of the changes, maps showing the changes and the land affected. Information on any updates to the reporting of likely significant environmental effects is also presented. The Information Change Note is free to read and download from the Documents section of the Project website (www.limedownsolar.co.uk).

The Applicant has notified properties in the vicinity of the proposed changes about the targeted consultation. The Applicant has also produced a dedicated Feedback Form (available online and in hard copy) and is accepting feedback in writing via Freepost and email via the Project-dedicated communications lines. Verbal representations will also be possible by appointment with the Project team (contact details listed at the end of this letter).

Hard copies of the targeted consultation materials (Information Change Note, Feedback Form) are available upon request by using the contact details listed at the end of this letter, and for inspection free of charge from 03 June to 11 July 2025 at the local venues listed below, which include the four Community Access Points listed in the published Statement of Community Consultation and an additional two further locations in proximity to the changes (Chipping Sodbury Community Library and Yate Library).



This newsletter provides an update on our proposals for Lime Down Solar Park, including on our preferred Cable Route Search Corridor and Targeted Consultation.

About Lime Down Solar Park

Lime Down Solar Park is a utility-scale solar park and battery energy storage project proposed to be built on land in Wiltshire. The Project involves the installation of solar panels and an on-site battery energy storage facility, with an underground cable connection into the National Grid at Melksham substation. Electricity generated would be made available for homes and businesses across the UK.

If consented, the solar park could deliver up to 500 megawatts (MW) of renewable energy. This is equivalent to providing enough clean affordable electricity to power approximately 115,000 homes annually.

Overview

Feedback received to our second stage of consultation (Jan - Mar 2025) is informing the refinement of our plans for Lime Down Solar Park, helping us develop our proposals responsibly and in a manner that recognises local community and stakeholder views.


We have indicatively identified a preferred Cable Route Search Corridor as a result of an initial review of feedback, as well as further design work and findings from ongoing environmental assessments.

Suitability is still being determined as we prepare our application for development consent later this year.

A stage of targeted consultation on some minor amendments to the project boundary will run from Tuesday 03 June to Friday 11 July 2025. Please see the overleaf for further information.



Project Updates

Cable Route Search Corridor

During our second stage of consultation, we presented a broad Cable Route Search Corridor, comprising the area in which the Cable Route Corridor would connect the Solar PV Sites to one another and to the existing Melksham Substation. We are proposing to build this connection by installing underground cable.

We continue to work to identify a location which avoids or minimises adverse effects to sensitive receptors, ecology, archaeology and other environmental impacts.

Following refinements and ongoing assessments since the Stage Two consultation, we have indicatively identified an initial preferred route, and are still assessing its suitability.

Targeted consultation on localised changes

We've made a series of minor amendments to the development boundary area for the Project, compared to the boundary which we consulted you on during our Stage Two consultation (Jan-Mar 2025).

- + Six areas to enable the temporary highway and traffic works that would be required to safely accommodate the Abnormal Indivisible Load (AIL) vehicles needed during the construction phase of the Project.
- + Nine areas where the development boundary has been adjusted to enable access to and within the Project site, and to avoid constraints such as woodland and hedgerows.

Subject to obtaining consent, the earliest construction would start is 2027.

The application we submit to PINS will include a Consultation Report summarising all the issues raised in feedback to consultation along with an explanation of how we have taken views into account to develop our final proposals. This report will be published on the Planning Inspectorate's website should our application be accepted for examination.

I am writing to you as Member of Parliament for South Cotswolds to confirm that the six-week targeted consultation on our proposals for Lime Down Solar Park has now ended, having come to a close at midnight on Friday 11 July 2025.

The purpose of this targeted stage of consultation was to invite feedback on a series of minor amendments we have made to the development boundary area for the Project, compared to the boundary which we consulted on during our Stage Two consultation (January - March 2025).

Although these changes are minor in nature and scale, we are committed to ensuring that relevant stakeholders are consulted on the changes prior to the application for development consent being submitted.

We thank all those who have taken part in this consultation, including people who attended our online information event on Thursday 19 June and all those who provided their written comments and feedback to us.

What happens next?

Feedback from our Stage Two statutory consultation and this stage of targeted consultation will continue to be considered alongside ongoing design and environmental work. This will help shape our refined design, which will be part of our Development Consent Order (DCO) application submission to the Planning Inspectorate (PINS).

Our final application will include a Consultation Report summarising the responses submitted to the consultation, along with an explanation of how we have taken those issues into account to develop our proposals for the Project.

We anticipate submitting our application in September 2025. After receiving our application, PINS has 28 days to decide whether to accept it so it can proceed to the examination stage. If accepted, PINS will publish all the application documents, including the Environmental Statement and Consultation Report, on its website.

Subject to our application being accepted for examination, you will have the opportunity to register with PINS to have your say at the pre-examination stage of the ongoing development process. Information about how you can have your say at different stages of the development process for

When the examination process concludes, PINS will make a recommendation to the Secretary of State for the Department of Energy Security and Net Zero (DESNZ) about whether the application should be approved. The decision on whether to grant final consent for Lime Down Solar Park will be made by the Secretary of State for DESNZ.
