Excavations from 1935 onwards by J Mossop yielded pottery dating to approximately AD100-300 (Event ID: ELI191). Droves, fields and small enclosures are present on APs. Excavations by Boston Archaeology Group in 1960 uncovered a possible hut site producing pottery and querns in the NW part of the field as well as clay lined troughs and handbricks(Event ID: ELI651. In 1961, an excavation for the Ministry of Works on a saltern site in the centre of the same field (Event ID: ELI127, Event ID: ELI4155). Kesteven College of Education investigated the SE drove way and two enclosures. The earliest feature was the enclosure S of the droveway containing late 2nd-early 3rd century pottery while a C14 date from the upper fill gave a date of 397-562 cal. AD. (MLI20016).
