

# The Droves Solar Farm

#### **Guide to the Application**

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#### 1 Introduction

#### 1.1 Purpose of this Document

- 1.1.1 This document provides a guide to the Development Consent Order (DCO) Application for The Droves Solar Farm (the 'Scheme'). The DCO Application is made by The Droves Solar Farm Limited ('the Applicant') to the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero (the Secretary of State) pursuant to the Planning Act 2008 (PA 2008).
- 1.1.2 The Scheme comprises the construction, operation, maintenance, and decommissioning of a solar photovoltaic (PV) electricity generating station and Associated Development comprising Battery Energy Storage System (BESS), a Customer Substation, and Grid Connection Infrastructure, including a new National Grid Substation. The Scheme would allow for the generation and export of over 50MW Alternating Current (AC) of renewable energy, connecting into the National Electricity Transmission System (NETS) overhead line that passes through the Site.
- 1.1.3 As the Scheme would have a generating capacity in excess of 50MW, it is considered to be a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) under the Planning Act 2008.
- 1.1.4 A full description of the Scheme is provided for in **Environmental Statement (ES)**Chapter 5: The Scheme [APP/6.1].
- 1.1.5 This Guide to the Application provides an overview of the documents that have been submitted in order to satisfy the Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009 (the APFP Regulations), the Town and Country Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 (the EIA Regulations) and section 37 of the PA 2008.
- 1.1.6 The APFP Regulations were updated in April 2024, and these updated APFP Regulations have been complied with within this DCO Application.
- 1.1.7 Regulation 5 of the APFP Regulations sets out the documents that all DCO applications must include. The APFP Regulations also provide at Regulation 5(2)(q) for the submission of "any other documents considered necessary to support the application" as well as at Regulation 5(2)(o) for "any other plans, drawings and sections necessary to describe the proposals".
- 1.1.8 Regulation 6 of the APFP Regulations sets out the specific documentation required in support of draft DCO applications for particular types of development, including generating stations and grid connections.
- 1.1.9 The Scheme constitutes an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) development, and therefore the EIA Regulations and requirements contained therein apply.



1.1.10 This Guide to the Application is a live document which, where requested by the Examining Authority ('ExA'), will be updated following each examination deadline to reflect submissions made by the Applicant, capturing both the latest versions of updated documents and recording new documents submitted as part of the examination.

#### 1.2 The Applicant

- 1.2.1 The Applicant is a 100% subsidiary of Island Green Power UK Projects Limited, which is in turn a 100% subsidiary of Island Green Power's UK group holding company, Island Green Power Group Limited (IGP). IGP is a leading international developer of renewable energy projects, with a focus on utility-scale solar projects and battery storage systems. IGP focuses on the entire project lifecycle of development from land sourcing, obtaining planning consents and permits and achieving grid connection with operations across the UK, Europe, Australia and New Zealand.
- 1.2.2 Established in 2013, with the founders operating for over 25 years in the energy market, IGP's mission is to help countries increase their solar energy usage, making more renewable energy possible whilst drastically reducing carbon emissions. IGP are committed to responsible land use, working with the belief that development and commercial delivery of solar farms can be achieved in harmony with their surrounds.
- 1.2.3 IGP have delivered nearly 40 solar projects worldwide that have generated more than 3 GW of energy capacity. This includes 21 solar projects in the UK. These range in size from below 5 MW to Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects (NSIPs) such as Cottam, currently the UK's largest consented solar project. Cottam will generate 600 MW of clean, renewable and secure electricity and includes 600 MW of Battery Storage that will store then release energy as needed.

#### 2 The Scheme

#### 2.1 Scheme Description

- 2.1.1 The Scheme comprises the construction, operation, maintenance, and decommissioning of a solar photovoltaic (PV) electricity generating station and Associated Development comprising Battery Energy Storage System (BESS), a Customer Substation, and Grid Connection Infrastructure, including a new National Grid Substation. The Scheme would allow for the generation and export of over 50MW Alternating Current (AC) of renewable energy, connecting into the National Electricity Transmission System (NETS) overhead line that passes through the Site.
- 2.1.2 A full description of the Scheme is provided for in **ES Chapter 5: The Scheme [APP/6.1]**.
- 2.1.3 The main objective of the Scheme is to generate low-carbon renewable energy that contributes to addressing the urgent need to decarbonise the UK's energy supply. The **Statement of Need [APP/5.4]** provides further details.

#### 2.2 The Order Limits

- 2.2.1 The Order limits are shown on the **Location Plan [APP/2.1**].
- 2.2.2 The total area extent of the Order limits is 838.77 hectares (ha) of land located within the administrative boundaries of Breckland Council (BC) and Norfolk County Council (NCC), who are the host authorities. The Order limits lie adjacent to the administrative boundary of the Borough Council of Kings Lynn & West Norfolk (KLWN).



### 3 Overview of Application Documents

#### 3.1 DCO Application

3.1.1 The documents submitted as part of the DCO Application have been grouped into the below document volumes noted within **Table 3.1** to accord with the Planning Inspectorate's (PINS) Nationally Significant Infrastructure projects: Advice on the Preparation and Submission of Application Documents published in August 2024 and updated in July 2025, and to meet the requirements of the APFP Regulations.

application consultation undertaken by the Applicant on the Scheme and how consultation feedback has been taken into account. In addition, a Statutory Nuisance Statement, Statement of Need, Planning Statement, Policy Compliance Document, Design Approach Document, Design Principles, Parameters and Commitments and Potential Main Issues for Examination (PMIE) are also included in Volume 5.

Volume 6 – Environmental Statement

Sets out the assessments undertaken by the Applicant to assess the likely significant effects of the Scheme on the environment, and details of mitigation measures proposed to reduce any adverse effects.

Volume 7 – Other Documents

Contains additional documents relating to the Scheme, including both those required by Regulation 6 of the APFP Regulations and those considered by the Applicant to be required to support the DCO Application in accordance with Regulation 5(2)(q) of the APFP Regulations.

- 3.1.2 The remainder of this Guide to the Application (**Sections 4** to **10**) provides a summary of the purpose of the documents and plans included within each volume described in **Table 3.1** above.
- 3.1.3 In addition, Appendix A.1 of this Guide to the Application provides a document schedule, which is a live document that will be updated during subsequent stages of the DCO Application, post-acceptance for examination, should additional documents be required or updates be made to documents.
- 3.1.4 A copy of all of the DCO Application submission documents will be available on the PINS website following acceptance for examination by PINS.

#### 3.2 Document Numbering

3.2.1 Documents are numbered in sequence within the respective volumes (as outlined in **Appendix A.1** of this Guide), with the volume number being the first digit of a document number. This is followed, where relevant, by an individual document number, figure and/or appendix number.



#### 3.3 Control Document

- 3.3.1 The DCO Application contains a number of control documents which establish the parameters, consenting envelope and secure the mitigation for the Scheme. These are proposed to be secured by the DCO and are as follows.

- 3.3.2 The list above forms part of the list of Certified Documents set out at Schedule 13 of the draft Development Consent Order (draft DCO) [APP/3.1], which includes other documents such as the Land Plan [APP/2.2] that form the overarching legal controls for the Scheme.

#### 3.4 Management Plans

- 3.4.1 The outline management plans included in Volume 7 (Other Documents) provide the framework and overarching principles for mitigation during the construction, operational and decommissioning phases of the Scheme.
- 3.4.2 The **draft DCO [APP/3.1]** includes Requirements that secure further detailed management plans where necessary. These detailed management plans are required to



be submitted to and approved by an identified statutory body. **Table 3.2** below sets out to which phases of the Scheme each outline management plan applies.

## 4 Volume 1 – Application Forms

- 4.1.1 The **Application Cover Letter [APP/1.1]** provides a brief description of the Scheme, its location, and a general introduction to the DCO Application.
- 4.1.2 The **Application Form [APP/1.2]** is the standard application form required by section 37(3)(b) of the PA 2008 to be submitted with the DCO Application. It provides a high-level summary of the Scheme and the documents that have been submitted for the Applicant's DCO Application.
- 4.1.3 The purpose of this **Guide to the Application [APP/1.3]** is referred to above in **Section 1.1** of this document.
- 4.1.4 The **Electronic Application Index [APP/1.4]** is the ordered list of all documents and information submitted with the DCO Application. It provides a plain English description of the information contained in each document, electronic file names, reference numbers for each document, and the relevant regulation reference.
- 4.1.5 A **Section 55 Checklist [APP/1.5]** is included to demonstrate how the DCO Application fulfils the conditions for acceptance by the Inspectorate under Section 55 of the PA 2008.
- 4.1.6 The **Pre-Application Programme Document [APP/1.6]** is a document that outlines the main steps the Applicant has taken to prepare the DCO Application during the pre-application phase.
- 4.1.7 The **Copies of Newspaper Notices [APP/1.7]** includes the newspaper notices, including text and any other information, that were included in newspapers to publicise the Scheme, such as for consultation events.



# Volume 2 – Plans, Drawings and Sections

- 5.1.1 In addition to the **Location Plan [APP/2.1]**, 10 additional plans are submitted as part of the DCO Application. In accordance with Regulation 5(4) of the APFP Regulations, where there are three or more separate drawing sheets, a key plan is provided to enable the reader to understand the relationship between the different sheets.
- 5.1.2 The **Land Plan [APP/2.2]** illustrates the land required for or affected by the Scheme. This includes: (a) land over which it is proposed to exercise powers of compulsory acquisition or any right to use land; (b) land in which it is proposed to extinguish easements, servitudes, and other private rights; and (c) land over which temporary possession is sought. These plans correspond to the **Book of Reference [APP/4.3]**.
- 5.1.3 The **Works Plan [APP/2.3]** demonstrate the relationship between the proposed location of the Scheme and the limits of deviation within which the development and works may be carried out. The areas on the **Works Plan [APP/2.3]** are numbered, and these correspond to the numbered works set out in Schedule 1 of the **draft DCO [APP/3.1]** which are proposed to be authorised by the DCO.
- 5.1.4 The **Streets Plan [APP/2.4]** illustrates any permanent and temporary alteration of streets and street works.
- 5.1.5 The **Access and Rights of Way Plan [APP/2.5]** illustrates any new or altered means of access and authorisation of use of motor vehicles over public rights of way and show the existing public rights of way network.
- 5.1.6 The **Waterbodies River Basin Management Plan [APP/2.6]** illustrates the quality status of waterbodies within the Northwest Norfolk River Basin Catchment.
- 5.1.7 The **Statutory Ecology and Nature Conservation Features Plan [APP/2.7]** illustrates the statutory ecological and nature conservation features in proximity to the Scheme.
- 5.1.8 The Non-Statutory Ecology and Nature Conservation Features Plan [APP/2.8] illustrates the non-statutory ecological and nature conservation features in proximity to the Scheme.
- 5.1.9 The **Statutory Historic Environment Features Plan [APP/2.9]** illustrates the statutory historic environmental features in proximity to the Scheme.
- 5.1.10 The **Non-Statutory Historic Environment Features Plan [APP/2.10]** illustrates the non-statutory historic environmental features in proximity to the Scheme.
- 5.1.11 The **Hedgerow Plan [APP/2.11]** identifies the hedgerows that can be removed as part of the Scheme.



# 6 Volume 3 – Draft Development Consent Order

- 6.1.1 The **draft DCO [APP/3.1]** contains the legal powers that the Applicant is seeking to enable the construction, operational, and decommissioning phases of the Scheme. This includes powers for compulsory acquisition and temporary possession of land. It is comprised of 49 articles and 16 schedules. The Schedules are outlined below:
  - Schedule 1 (Authorised development)
  - Schedule 2 (Requirements)
  - Schedule 3 (Legislation to be disapplied)
  - Schedule 4 (Streets subject to street works)
  - Schedule 5 (Alteration of streets)

  - Schedule 9 (Land in which only new rights etc. may be acquired)
  - Schedule 10 (Modification of compensation and compulsory purchase enactments for the creation of new rights and imposition of new restrictive covenants)
  - Schedule 11 (Land of which temporary possession may be taken)
  - Schedule 12 (Hedgerows to be removed)
  - Schedule 13 (Documents and plans to be certified)
  - Schedule 14 (Arbitration rules)
  - · Schedule 15 (Protective Provisions); and
  - Schedule 16 (Procedure for discharge of requirements).
- 6.1.2 The **Explanatory Memorandum [APP/3.2]** to the **draft DCO [APP/3.1]** explains the purpose and effect of each provision in the **draft DCO [APP/3.1]** including why it is considered necessary, as required by Regulation 5(2)(c) of the APFP Regulations. It also identifies examples of precedents from other DCOs where applicable.
- 6.1.3 A **draft DCO Template Validation Report [APP/3.3]** is also provided and confirms the validation of the **draft DCO [APP/3.1]**.



## 7 Volume 4 – Compulsory Acquisition Information

- 7.1.1 The Applicant is seeking statutory powers to acquire land, obtain rights in land, extinguish rights in land, and possess and use land temporarily in order to construct, operate and maintain the Scheme.
- 7.1.2 The **Statement of Reasons [APP/4.1]**, as required under Regulation 5(2)(h) of the APFP Regulations, explains that there is a compelling case in the public interest which would justify the Applicant's exercise of compulsory acquisition in order to acquire land and rights permanently, and to use land temporarily to enable the construction, operational, and decommissioning phases of the Scheme.
- 7.1.3 The **Funding Statement [APP/4.2]**, required under Regulation 5(2)(h) of the APFP Regulations, details how the Scheme would be funded, including the funding of any compulsory acquisition.
- 7.1.4 The **Book of Reference [APP/4.3]** identifies all parties who own or occupy land and/or who may be entitled to make a 'relevant claim' as defined in section 57 of the PA 2008. The **Book of Reference [APP/4.3]** is required under Regulation 5(2)(d) of the APFP Regulations and is structured in five parts in accordance with the APFP Regulations as follows:
  - Part 1
  - Part 2
  - Part 3
  - · Part 4: Crown Land; and
  - Part 5: Special Parliamentary Procedure, Special Category or Replacement Land.
- 7.1.5 The Land and Rights Negotiations Tracker [APP/4.4] consolidates the status of land and rights negotiations and serves to provide mature and robust evidence to support the application for compulsory acquisition and temporary possession powers in the draft DCO [APP/3.1].



## 8 Volume 5 – Reports and Statements

- 8.1.1 The Consultation Report [APP/5.1] and the Consultation Report Appendices [APP/5.2] provide details of the pre-application consultation that has taken place. The report details the non-statutory consultation, the statutory consultation and the targeted consultations that have been undertaken as part of the pre-application process.
- 8.1.2 The **Consultation Report [APP/5.1]** explains how the Applicant has complied with the requirements set out in the PA 2008, the APFP Regulations and the EIA Regulations. The report is also in accordance with the guidance set out in the Planning Inspectorate's Advice on the Consultation Report (published August 2024) and the Planning Inspectorate's Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects: Advice on the Preparation and Submission of Application Documents (August 2024).
- 8.1.3 The **Consultation Report [APP/5.1]** is structured as follows:

- 8.1.5 The **Statutory Nuisance Statement [APP/5.3]** identifies the matters set out in Section 79 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 in respect of statutory nuisances and considers whether the Scheme would engage one or more of those matters, as required by Regulation 5(2)(f) of the APFP Regulations. Where any matters may be potentially engaged, the statement sets out the proposals for mitigating them.
- 8.1.6 The **Statement of Need [APP/5.4]** explains the need for the Scheme, supporting the case made in the National Policy Statements relevant to energy infrastructure for low carbon energy generation which is of critical national priority. It draws upon established and emerging primary analysis and opinion by respected third parties, to support the case that the Scheme is required to ensure that the UK remains on track to meet its legally binding carbon emissions reduction targets while enhancing national security of supply, and at a cost which, in relation to other electricity generation infrastructure developments, provides value for money for end-use consumers.
- 8.1.7 The **Planning Statement [APP/5.5]** details the Scheme's compliance with the relevant planning policy framework at both national and local levels and any other matters which the Applicant considers are both important and relevant to the Secretary of State's decision. As part of the **Planning Statement [APP/5.5]**, there is one appendix being a Site Evaluation Report.
- 8.1.8 The **Policy Compliance Document [APP/5.6]** provides a comprehensive assessment of the Scheme against the relevant policy and guidance documents.
- 8.1.9 The **Design Approach Document [APP/5.7]** provides information regarding the context of the Scheme's location and context, the design approach and evolution, the green infrastructure strategy, and the detailed design process. The **Design Approach Document [APP/5.7]** is submitted in three parts.
- 8.1.10 The **Design Principles, Parameters and Commitments [APP/5.8]** secures the principles, parameters and commitments for the detailed design of the Scheme.
- 8.1.11 The **Potential Main Issues for Examination [APP/5.9]** document provides the Examining Authority with a summary of the main residual issues with key stakeholders remaining at the time of the DCO Application's submission.



# 9 Volume 6 – Environmental Impact Assessment

- 9.1.1 The Applicant has conducted an EIA for the Scheme to consider the likely effects of the Scheme on the environment.

- 10.1.1 Volume 7 provides other documents which the Applicant has submitted to adhere to the APFP Regulations and/or which are considered by the Applicant to be required to support the DCO Application.
- 10.1.2 The **Grid Connection Statement [APP/7.1]** has been submitted in accordance with Regulations 5(2)(p) and 6(1)(a)(i) of the APFP Regulations. It outlines the details for connecting the Scheme to the National Grid.
- 10.1.3 The **Equality Impact Assessment [APP/7.2]** considers the potential equality impacts related to the DCO Application for the construction, operational, and decommissioning phases of the Scheme.
- 10.1.4 The **Shadow Habitats Regulations Assessment [APP/7.3]** sets out the screening report to determine whether or not development plans could negatively impact local plans on a recognised protected European site beyond reasonable scientific doubt.
- 10.1.5 The **Biodiversity Net Gain Assessment Report [APP/7.4]** presents the Biodiversity Net Gain Assessment which details the predicted biodiversity net gain that could be delivered by the Scheme.
- The Applicant requires a range of consents and agreements to construct and operate the Scheme. As explained in the **Explanatory Memorandum [APP/3.2]** to the **draft DCO [APP/3.1]**, some of these are included in the draft Order. However, there are other consents from different regulatory organisations that will be required separately from the Order. The need for such consents and how they are to be obtained is explained in the **Consents and Agreements Position Statement [APP/7.5]** required under other legislation.
- 10.1.7 The **oCEMP [APP/7.6]** sets out the measures that will be included in detailed Construction Environmental Management Plan(s) to control potential environmental and amenity impacts of construction. In addition, the management plan provides a framework for construction environmental controls.
- 10.1.8 The **oCTMP [APP/7.7]** sets out the measures that will be provided in detailed Construction Traffic Management Plan(s) for the traffic generated during the Scheme's construction phase.
- 10.1.9 The **oOEMP [APP/7.8]** sets out the measures that will be included in detailed Operational Environmental Management Plan(s) to control potential environmental and amenity impacts of the operation of the Scheme. In addition, the management plan provides a framework for operational environmental controls.



- 10.1.10 The **oOTMP [APP/7.9]** sets out the measures that will be provided in detailed Operational Traffic Management Plan(s) for the traffic generated during the Scheme's operational phase.
- 10.1.11 The **oDS** [APP/7.10] sets out the measures that will be included in detailed Decommissioning Strategy(ies) to control potential environmental and amenity impacts of the Scheme's decommissioning phase. In addition, the management plan provides a framework for decommissioning environmental controls.
- 10.1.12 The **oLEMP [APP/7.11]** provides a framework for delivering the green infrastructure elements of the Scheme for the pre-construction and operational phase of the Scheme including the successful establishment and future management of the proposed landscape and ecological works for the duration of the Scheme's operational phase.
- 10.1.13 The **oPRoWPPMP** [APP/7.12] outlines how the public rights of way network and permissive paths will be managed by the Applicant in relation to the Scheme. This is to ensure that they have been suitably considered and are able to operate, in terms of both user safety and accessibility, during the construction, operational, and decommissioning phases of the Scheme.
- 10.1.14 The **oSMP [APP/7.13]** sets out the measures that will be included in detailed Soil Management Plan(s) and will include measures for soil handling, soil moisture content assessments and storage and trafficking of soils during the construction, operational, and decommissioning phases of the Scheme.
- 10.1.15 The aim of the **oBSMP [APP/7.14]** is to define the proposed safety strategy, requirements, and processes necessary to meet derived safety objectives and to set a level of safety performance that the installation is to be measured against.
- 10.1.16 The **oESSCS [APP/7.15]** outlines how the Applicant would promote the delivery of economic benefits generated by the Scheme to local people and businesses across Norfolk.
