

My family live at Grove Farm House on the The Green, Saxlingham Nethergate.

I strongly recommend the Inspectors visit The Green at least as far as the entrance to Grove Farm House. Why:

- The Green is planned to be used as one of the main access points for this part of the East Pye scheme.
 - The Green is a small country lane largely in a conservation area and entirely unsuitable for the massive HGVs that East Pye will be using for deliveries.
 - It is part of the Boudicca Way walking route, hence well used by walkers who will be put at risk by the substantial vehicles.
 - It is also home to Saxlingham Hall Nursing Home and is used by relatives of residents to take them for wheelchair walks. What could be more incompatible than the huge lorries and the elderly in wheelchairs with no easy way to get off the road at most points?
 - Our traditional Norfolk clay lump barns back directly onto road along The Green at the narrowest point putting them at very high risk of being clobbered by the huge lorries.
 - It is intended by East Pye to fell a large number of trees at the point where the small mud track that runs alongside our north western boundary meets The Green. Another entirely inappropriate action.
 - It is also proposed to use the mud track (which is both a farm track and public footpath) as a major entry point to the site which will undoubtedly mean widening it and metalling it, completely changing the character and nature of the track and indeed the area.
 - We did not move to live on The Green to have it industrialised, not to mention the noise and disturbance the development construction will generate.
- It would make eminently more sense for the whole of this section of the development to be accessed from Broaden Lane. I can only presume East Pye are not choosing to do this to save themselves money.
