ECOPOWER SUFFOLK SOLAR – LAND IN THE VICINITY OF SETTLEMENTS AT YAXLEY, BROME, EYE, GISLINGHAM, MELLIS AND OCCOLD

CONSULTATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 46 ‘DUTY TO NOTIFY SECRETARY OF STATE OF PROPOSED APPLICATION’ OF THE PLANNING ACT 2008

I write on behalf of EcoPower Suffolk Limited (the ‘Applicant’) in connection with EcoPower Suffolk Solar (the ‘Proposed Development’).

The Applicant is proposing to submit a Development Consent Order (DCO) application (the ‘Application’) seeking development consent pursuant to Section 37 ‘Applications for orders granting development consent’ of the Planning Act 2008 (the ‘PA 2008’) from the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero (the ‘SoS’) for the construction, operation, maintenance and decommissioning of a solar photovoltaic (‘PV’) farm and a Battery Energy Storage System (‘BESS’) with a generating capacity of over 100 megawatts (‘MW’).

The Site is located on land near to the settlements of Stutson, Oakley, Thrandeston, Hoxne, Yaxley, Brome, Eye, Gislingham, Mellis and Occold within the administrative areas of Babergh and Mid Suffolk District Council and Suffolk County Council. The market town of Diss is located approximately 850 metres to the north at its closest point. The Site is approximately 1,175 hectares (ha). This comprises approximately 900 ha of land for the Principal Area and 275 ha for the Cable Corridors. Approximately 650 ha of the Principal Area will be for the solar areas and approximately 5 ha has been allowed for the centralised BESS areas.

This letter represents the Applicant’s notification of the SoS of the Proposed Application pursuant to Section 46 ‘Duty to notify secretary of state of proposed application’ of the PA 2008. The submission of the Application will follow a period of statutory pre-application consultation carried out pursuant to section 42, section 47 and section 48 of the Act, the Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedures) Regulations 2009 (the “APFP Regulations”), and the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. The consultation will commence 22 June 2026 and all feedback must be provided by the close of consultation at 11:59pm on Sunday 16 August 2026.

The Applicant will publish consultation materials including documents such as plans, maps, Preliminary Environmental Information, Consultation Information Booklet, Feedback Form, and Statement of Community Consultation. The consultation materials will be available to view free of charge online at www.ecopowersuffolk.com (under the 'document library' tab) and hard copies of the Consultation Information Booklet and Feedback form will be available to take away at deposit points in the local area from the start of the consultation period on 22 June 2026.

A notice pursuant to Section 48 'Duty to publicise' of the PA 2008 (the 'Section 48 Notice') has been, and will be, published as follows: the Guardian Times (22 June) the London Gazette (22 June) the Diss Express (19 June) and the East Anglian Daily Times (19 June).

In accordance with Regulation 13 'Pre-application publicity under Section 48 (duty to publicise)' of 'The Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017' (the 'EIA Regulations'), the Applicant will also send a copy of the Section 48 Notice to the relevant consultation bodies on or around 19 June in either paper copy (where paper service is used) or PDF (where e-mail service is used). No persons were notified to the Applicant under EIA Regulation 11(1(c)).

I look forward to receiving the SoS's acknowledgement of the Applicant's notification of the SoS of the Proposed Application pursuant to Section 46 'Duty to notify Secretary of State of proposed application' of the PA 2008. EcoPower Suffolk Solar - Statutory Pre-Application Consultation (22 June 2026 – 16 August 2026) under Section 42 of the Planning Act 2008, Regulation 3 of the Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009 and Regulations 11 and 13 of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 (“the 2017 Regulations”)

We are writing to consult with you on the proposed application for EcoPower Suffolk Solar (“the Project”). EcoPower Suffolk Limited (“the Applicant”) intends to apply to the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero for a Development Consent Order (“DCO”) under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 (“the Act”) for the construction, operation and decommissioning of the Project.

Project Description

The Project will involve the construction of ground-mounted solar photovoltaic (PV) modules, battery energy storage systems and associated infrastructure and cabling, to be located on land near Yaxley, Brome, Eye, Gislegham, Mellis and Occold within the administrative areas of Mid Suffolk District Council (MSDC) and Suffolk County Council (SCC). The Project is a major renewable energy project that will generate clean electricity from solar power. The project would have a generating capacity of more than 100MW, generating enough power to supply around 75,000 homes annually.

The Project has been carefully designed to minimise visual and environmental impact. The Project will connect directly to Yaxley Substation, helping to support local grid stability and contributing to the UK’s renewable energy targets. The Project requires an Environmental Impact Assessment (“EIA”) for the purposes of the 2017 Regulations. The Applicant is preparing Preliminary Environmental Information (PEI) to help you understand the likely effects of our proposals on the environment.

An Environmental Statement will be prepared and submitted as part of the DCO application.

Further information can be found in the consultation materials referred to below.

Consultation materials

The Applicant draws your attention to the information on the project website (available here: www.ecopowersuffolk.com) and the statutory consultation documents (available here: www.ecopowersuffolk.com/document-library) which will be available from Monday 22 June 2026 up to the close of the consultation.

As part of the DCO process, the Applicant is currently required to carry out pre-application consultation in accordance with section 42 of the Act. We would be grateful for your views on the proposals described in the consultation materials to help inform and further refine our proposals.

The Applicant will undertake the consultation in accordance with the current legal requirements and will include:

- Prescribed bodies, host and neighbouring authorities, and any persons with an interest in the land affected by the Project under section 42 of the Act;
- Affected local communities under section 47 of the Act; and
- General publicity under section 48 of the Act.

The statutory consultation commences on 22 June 2026 and will close at 11.59pm on 16 August 2026. Please see below for information on how to view and comment on the Project.

Notice of Publication of a Statement of Community Consultation and Notice Publicising a Proposed Application for a Development Consent Order for EcoPower Suffolk Solar

Notice is hereby given that EcoPower Suffolk Limited of 3rd Floor, 10 Foster Lane, London, England, EC2V 6HR (the ‘Applicant’) intends to submit an application (the ‘Proposed Application’) to the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero (the ‘SoS’) for a Development Consent Order (‘DCO’) under section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 (the ‘2008 Act’).

The Proposed Application is for EcoPower Suffolk Solar (the ‘Project’), a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project under sections 14 and 15 of the 2008 Act.

Statement of Community Consultation

Notice is also hereby given that the Applicant has produced a Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC) in accordance with section 47 of the 2008 Act. This notice publicises where and when the SoCC can be inspected.

The SoCC sets out how the Applicant will fulfil its duty to consult with the local community and undertake its consultation with people in the vicinity of the Proposed Application.

Additionally, the Applicant has a duty to publicise the Proposed Application under section 48 of the 2008 Act in accordance with Regulation 4 of the 2009 Regulations. In accordance with those provisions, this notice also summarises the main proposals and explains where the consultation documents can be viewed.

Summary of the Project

The land required for the Project (the ‘Site’) is situated on land near to the settlements of Yaxley, Brome, Eye, Gislingham, Mellis and Occold within the administrative areas of Mid Suffolk District Council (MSDC) and Suffolk County Council (SCC). The Site includes the following five discrete land parcel areas (‘Principal Area’) proposed for the installation of solar PV panels, ecological mitigation or battery energy storage systems (‘BESS’):

- Area 1: Land south of Stuston (Area 1 Stuston);
- Area 2: Land north of Eye (Area 2 Eye);
- Area 3: Land north of Gislingham (Area 3 Gislingham);

- Area 4: Land north of Occold (Area 4 Occold); and
- Area 5: Land south of Thrandeston and north of Mellis (Area 5 Thrandeston and Mellis).

The Site is approximately 1,175 ha (hectares). This comprises approximately 900 ha of land for the Principal Area and 275 ha for the Cable Corridors. Approximately 650 ha of the Principal Area will be for the solar areas and approximately 5 ha has been allowed for the centralised BESS areas.

The Project comprises the construction, operation, maintenance and decommissioning of a ground mounted solar park with a generating capacity of more than 100 (megawatts) of alternating current (AC) capacity. The Project will connect to the National Grid via underground cabling to the Yaxley Substation.

The Project comprises the following key physical elements:

- Solar photovoltaic (PV) modules;
- Solar PV module mounting structures;
- BESS;
- Inverters;
- Transformers;
- Switchgear;
- Substations;
- On-site cabling;
- Biodiversity and landscaping enhancement, including environmental mitigation;
- Maintenance and welfare facilities;
- Fencing, boundary treatments, security measures and lighting;
- Drainage and utility works; and
- Highway works including temporary and permissive access tracks.

The proposed DCO would authorise (among other things), if required:

- the compulsory acquisition of land and/or rights in, on, under or over land required for the Project, as well as rights authorising the temporary occupation of land for the Project;
- the extinguishment and/or overriding of easements and other rights over or affecting land required for the Project;
- the application and/or disapplication of legislation relevant to the Project;
- the diversion or temporary stopping up of public rights of way during construction works;
- such associated and ancillary works, provisions, permits and consents as are required for the construction, operation, maintenance and decommissioning of the Project.

EIA Development

The Project is an Environmental Impact Assessment ('EIA') development as defined by the EIA Regulations and an Environmental Statement ('ES') will form part of the Proposed Application. The Applicant has notified the SoS in writing under Regulation 8(1)(b) of the EIA Regulations that it intends to provide an ES in respect of the Project. The ES will provide a detailed description of the Project and its likely significant environmental effects. Information compiled so far about the Project's likely significant environmental impacts is contained in the Preliminary Environmental Information (PEI), which forms part of the consultation material.

Consultation on the proposals will take place from **22 June to 16 August 2026** (the 'Consultation Period'). Responses must be received no later than 11:59pm on 16 August 2026 and responses received after that date may not be considered.

The consultation documents show the nature and location of the Project and include plans, maps, and the PEI, among other documents ('the Consultation Documents'). The Consultation Documents will be available to view or download free of charge from www.ecopowersuffolk.com (the 'Project Website') throughout the duration of the Consultation Period, from 22 June to 11:59pm on 16 August 2026. The Consultation Documents can be accessed under the 'document library' tab.

All Consultation Documents will be available online to view on the Project Website (www.ecopowersuffolk.com). A hard copy of the Consultation Documents can also be supplied, but there will be a reasonable charge of £0.40 per page to cover the printing and posting costs associated with this.
