# Advice following issue of decision to accept the application for examination

On 23 April 2025 the Secretary of State decided that the application for the above project satisfied the acceptance tests under section 55 of the Planning Act 2008 (PA2008). The Planning Inspectorate's acceptance checklist and the application documents have been published and made available on the project page of our website.

In undertaking checks at the acceptance stage, the Inspectorate has made some initial observations in relation to the application. This letter comprises advice to the applicant provided under section 51 of the PA2008 in respect of these initial observations. The applicant should pay attention to its content and consider how appropriate action might be taken in response.

#### Consultees identified on a precautionary basis

Given the individual circumstances of this case, the Planning Inspectorate advises taking a precautionary approach to consultation under s42(1)(a) of PA2008 to ensure that all persons potentially affected by, or potentially likely to have an interest in the application are given the opportunity to participate fully in the examination of the application. On this basis, the applicant may wish to serve notice on the bodies listed in Box 6 of the section 55 checklist when it serves notice of the accepted application under s56(2)(a) of the PA2008; unless there is a specific justification why this is not necessary.



# ES Part 2 Suffolk Chapter 2 Appendix 2.2.A Extended Phase 1 Habitat Survey Report (Doc 6.3.2.2.A) and ES Part 3 Kent Chapter 2 Appendix 3.2.A Extended Phase 1 Habitat Survey Report (Doc 6.3.3.2.A)

These survey reports are watermarked as confidential. Whilst the report contains some confidential information (for example in relation to badger setts) most of the information does not appear to be confidential, as its release would not adversely affect protections of the environment to which the information relates. The applicant is requested to provide 2 versions of these survey reports, to enable the information that is not confidential to be published in line with duties under the Environmental Information Regulations. The survey reports should be provided as soon as possible before commencement of the examination.

# Part 2 Suffolk Chapter 3 Cultural Heritage (Doc 6.2.2.3) and ES Part 2 Suffolk Chapter 3 Appendix 2.3.F Phase 1 Archaeological Trial Trenching Report (Draft) (Doc 6.3.2.3.F)

Appendix 2.3.F presents results of the completed trial trenching (Phase 1 and 1b) but it is labelled as draft. The Consultation Report, Appendix E (Part 4 of 4) (**Doc 5.1.6**) indicates that a limited area of Phase 2b would not be complete until March 2025. ES Part 2 Suffolk Chapter 3 Cultural Heritage states that the Outline Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) (**Doc 7.5.4.1**) would be updated during examination following receipt of the final fieldwork report for the trial trench evaluation, but it was not considered that the absence of this fieldwork was a meaningful limitation to the assessment. The applicant is requested to provide a final version of the trial trenching report including the results of work carried out in March 2025, and an updated Outline WSI reflecting this information, as soon as possible before commencement of the examination.

# ES Part 4 Marine Chapter 6 Marine Archaeology (Doc 6.2.4.6)

ES Part 4 Marine Chapter 6 Marine Archaeology states that additional geotechnical surveys were undertaken in October 2024 to duplicate earlier vibrocores that were destroyed. The results have not been included in the ES and are proposed to be submitted as a standalone document when complete. It states that the existing baseline information from geophysical survey and geoarchaeological deposit models (presented in the Marine Archaeological Technical Report Figures (**Doc 6.4.4.6.A**) and summarised in ES Appendix 6.4.A (**Doc 6.3.4.6.A**) is suitable to inform impact assessment. The applicant is requested to provide results of the October 2024 surveys and set out any implications for the ES assessment conclusions as soon as possible before commencement of the examination.

### ES Part 4 Marine Chapter 2 Benthic Ecology (Doc 6.2.4.2)

The Consultation Report, Appendix E (Part 4 of 4) (**Doc 5.1.6**) response to the 2023 statutory consultation page 213 states that "The results from the comprehensive geophysical survey, preliminary imagery and survey logs are being integrated with our existing 2021 data and supplemented with existing environmental information from available sources such as One Benthic to provide confidence in the assessment. The final results of the most recent survey campaign will be provided prior to examination as supplementary information in order to provide an additional confidence in the conclusions."

Please explain your programme for submission of the supplementary information.



It is assumed that these are the only outstanding submissions but in responding, please confirm whether there are any other outstanding or pending submissions proposed for any subject and, if so, their anticipated date of submission.

## Flood Risk Assessment (Doc 6.8)

The Environment Agency (EA) released updated flood risk and coastal erosion data in March 2025, shortly before the application was submitted. The flood risk assessment (FRA) has therefore not been based on the most up to date EA data. The applicant is requested to review the latest EA flood risk data and confirm any implications for the FRA. An updated FRA should be submitted as soon as possible before commencement of the examination if necessary following this review.

The FRA states that localised areas of the proposed development are in Flood Zone 3 (shown on Figure 1 of Appendix A). It does not distinguish between Flood Zones 3(a) and 3(b). The applicant is requested to provide plans showing Flood Zones 3a and 3b differentiated or explain why this is information is not required in respect of the proposed development.

### **Funding Statement**

Paragraph 3.2.17 of the Funding Statement states that "The estimated cost of implementing the Proposed Project is approximately £1.1bn (18/19 price)." This cost estimate is based on prices from circa six years ago. Please can this be updated or otherwise explain why this estimated cost is still relevant to the proposed development.

#### Minor errors and omissions

There are minor errors and omissions, as reflected in Box 30 of the acceptance checklist.

The Planning Inspectorate has noted minor labelling and typographic errors in the documents as listed in box 30 of the s55 checklist, with examples given below. We advise that the applicant takes these comments into account and completes a comprehensive review to correct these and to identify and correct any other formatting errors and omissions before submitting any updated versions of application documents in future.
