I am speaking on behalf of Emma Tolley who, as you will know from her submission, is the resident of a caravan in Ebbsfleet Lane within the Draft Order Limits for a construction road. These are her words.

"I do not know the name of the suited and booted young guy who turned up in as flashy car to talk to me. National Grid have never been anywhere near me and they clearly don't even know my name. He left me a stack of paper I don't understand. Karen helped me to write to you.

I choose to live where I do, because I can be in a peaceful area, live how I choose and not bother anyone. I get on well with my neighbours one of whom looks after my cat when I'm away. The lane is a dead end so I'm not in anyone's way.

Thanet District Council and or the County Council might have the powers to evict me – but haven't done so because. I'm not bothering anyone. I keep the area clean and tidy.

So I object to NG using the road I live on as a construction road. This is where I live and I want a quiet life. They are going to wreck it.

If the Grid people were to try and evict me – they don't have the power to do so. And it would make me homeless. I have no where else to go. The council would have to find me another home (not that I want one).

Just leave me alone and take your b[REDACTED] building somewhere else.

Better still just stop the project. It's the wrong location for the wildlife. They will suffer more than me – they don't have a caravan. But like me they have a quiet and peaceful home that is at risk from this project.
