

The old hover port site should not be used in the construction of the proposed convertor station by the national grid. It is next to a protected nature reserve and will be detrimental to many wildlife species including birds, reptiles and insects. Also natural fauna will be disturbed including a rare orchid which now grows there. The land is a quiet space used for recreation by local people. We go there every week to walk and unwind. The disturbance to the natural environment would be unacceptable including a loss of dearly valued peaceful area that local people need in our rapidly developing local environment.
