To Whom it May Concern,

I object more and more to the above project as the weeks go on.

Recent research has unearthed even more proof that this Sea Link project is not needed! Please see below.

The Applicant alleges that Sea Link is "required for the connection of Five Estuaries OWF and firm connection of Rampion."

Rampion connects within SC2 but there is no mention of the requirement for infrastructure reinforcement within SC2 to enable Rampion to connect at Bolney in either the Ex A recommended report, or the SoS decision letter. In fact Sea Link was not mentioned AT ALL in either the Ex A recommendation report or the SoS decision letter.
