  15 m in height) within proposed Cable Sealing End ("CSE") compounds, or existing or
  proposed substations
- approximately 25 km of 400 kV underground cabling some of which is located through the Dedham Vale National Landscape (formerly known as Dedham Vale AONB)
- six new CSE compounds, each with a permanent access, to connect the overhead lines to the underground cables
- a new 400 kV East Anglia Connection Node ("EACN") substation, with a new permanent access, on the Tendring Peninsula. This is proposed to be an Air Insulated Switchgear ("AIS") substation

# Thousands of children unsure of gender identity 'let down by NHS'

Landmark report blames 'toxic' trans debate and unproven treatments

Thousands of vulnerable children questioning their gender identity have been let down by the NHS providing unproven treatments and by the "toxicity" of the trans debate,

a report has found. The UK's only NHS gender identity development service used puberty blockers and cross-sex hormones, which masculinise or feminise people's appearances, despite "remarkably weak evidence" that they improve the wellbeing of young people and concern they may harm health, Dr Hilary Cass said.

Cass, a leading consultant paedi-atrician, stressed that her findings were not intended to undermine the validity of trans identities or

challenge people's right to transition, but rather to improve the care of the fast-growing number of children and young people with gender-related

But she said this care was made even more difficult to provide by the polarised public debate and the way in which opposing sides had "pointed to research to justify a position, regardless of the quality of the studies". She added: "There are few other areas of healthcare where professionals are so afraid to openly discuss their views, where people are

vilified on social media, and where name-calling echoes the worst bully-ing behaviour, This must stop."

NHS England commissioned her inquiry in 2020 amid rising concern over the care provided by the Tavistock and Portman NHS mental health trust's gender identity development services (Gids). From 2009 to 2020, it treated about 9,000 children and young people, with an average age at referral of 14.

The inquiry has already led to NHS England shutting Gids, banning puberty blockers and switching to a

new "holistic" model of care in which under-18s experiencing confusion about their gender identity will routinely receive psychological support rather than medical intervention.

"For most young people, a medical pathway will not be the best way to manage their gender-related distress. For those young people for whom a medical pathway is clinically indicated, it is not enough to provide this without also addressing wider mental health and/or psychosocially challenging problems," 6



# Tory divisions exposed as Sunak smoking ban moves a step closer

Flagship bill passes but Badenoch and Truss lead sizeable revolt

A ban on smoking for future generations moved a step closer night but Rishi Sunak suffered a blow to his authority after dozens of Conservative MPs voted against it.

The House of Commons voted by 383 to 67 in favour of the prime minis-ter's plan to make it illegal for anyone born in 2009 or later to buy tobacco products in the UK.

The legislation, which would in effect ban smoking for future generations by raising the legal age every year, is seen by Sunak's allies as a key

part of his political legacy.

However, the result of a vote on one of Sunak's high-profile policies - which saw the potential future lead-ership contender Kemi Badenoch and five other ministers join 51 more Tory

MPs to vote against - underlined the

depth of division within the party. Labour has thrown its weight behind the plan, which was unveiled at Tory party conference in October, ensuring that it sailed through the Commons, More than 100 Tory MPs abstained, although some of them will have been absent from the Commons for unrelated reasons.

Badenoch, the business secretary, was the only cabinet minister to vote against the legislation. She said beforehand she had "significant concerns" because the legislation meant

# Thousands of children unsure of gender identity 'let down by NHS'

Landmark report blames 'toxic' trans debate and unproven treatments

Thousands of vulnerable children questioning their gender identity have been let down by the NHS providing unproven treatments and by the "toxicity" of the trans debate,

a report has found. The UK's only NHS gender identity development service used puberty blockers and cross-sex hormones, which masculinise or feminise people's appearances, despite "remarkably weak evidence" that they improve the wellbeing of young people and concern they may

harm health, Dr Hilary Cass said. Cass, a leading consultant paediatrician, stressed that her findings were not intended to undermine the validity of trans identities or

challenge people's right to transition, but rather to improve the care of the fast-growing number of children and young people with gender-related

But she said this care was made even more difficult to provide by the polarised public debate and the way in which opposing sides had "pointed to research to justify a position, regardless of the quality of the studies". She added: "There are few other areas of healthcare where professionals are so afraid to openly discuss their views, where people are

vilified on social media, and where name-calling echoes the worst bully-ing behaviour. This must stop."

NHS England commissioned her inquiry in 2020 amid rising concern over the care provided by the Tavis tock and Portman NHS mental health trust's gender identity development services (Gids). From 2009 to 2020. it treated about 9,000 children and young people, with an average age at referral of 14.

The inquiry has already led to NHS England shutting Gids, banning puberty blockers and switching to a

new "holistic" model of care in which under-18s experiencing confusion about their gender identity will routinely receive psychological support rather than medical intervention.

"For most young people, a medical pathway will not be the best way to manage their gender-related distress. For those young people for whom a medical pathway is clinically indicated, it is not enough to provide this without also addressing wider mental health and/or psychosocially challenging problems," 6

## **Ministers** announce shoplifting crackdown



The government is investing more than £55m in expanding facial recognition systems - including mobile vans that will scan crowded high streets - as part of a renewed crackdown on shoplifting.

The investment was announced alongside plans for tougher punishments for serial or abusive shoplifters in England and Wales, including perpetrators being forced to wear a tag to ensure they don't revisit the scene of their crime, under a new criminal office of assaulting a retail worker.

The new law, which would carry a jail term of up to six months and unlimited fines, will be introduced via an amendment to the criminal justice bill working its way through parliament.

Ahead of the change in the law, which could happen as early as this summer, the government said it would invest £55.5m over the next four years in facial recognition technology to help

# Tory divisions exposed as Sunak smoking ban moves a step closer

Flagship bill passes but Badenoch and Truss lead sizeable revolt

A ban on smoking for future generations moved a step closer night but Rishi Sunak suffered a blow to his authority after dozens of Conservative MPs voted against it.

The House of Commons voted by 383 to 67 in favour of the prime minis-ter's plan to make it illegal for anyone born in 2009 or later to buy tobacco products in the UK.

The legislation, which would in effect ban smoking for future generations by raising the legal age every year, is seen by Sunak's allies as a key part of his political legacy.

However, the result of a vote on

one of Sunak's high-profile policies - which saw the potential future lead-ership contender Kemi Badenoch and five other ministers join 51 more Tory

MPs to vote against - underlined the

depth of division within the party. Labour has thrown its weight behind the plan, which was unveiled at Tory party conference in October, ensuring that it sailed through the Commons, More than 100 Tory MPs abstained, although some of them will have been absent from the Commons for unrelated reasons.

Badenoch, the business secretary, was the only cabinet minister to vote against the legislation. She said beforehand she had "significant concerns" because the legislation meant

that "people born a day apart will have permanently different rights"

She told LBC after the vote: "I don't think the end justifies the means. The principle I was against was treating adults differently, and how that would be enforced. It didn't feel right

Five other ministers - Julia Lopez, Alex Burghart, Steve Baker, Lee Rowley and Andrew Griffith - also voted against, Penny Mordaunt, leader of the Commons, abstained.
Conservative MPs were given a free

vote, although Andrea Leadsom, the junior health minister in charge of the bill, contacted some of them to make the government's case


# Appendix H5.1 Location map of S48 Notices at 5km Intervals along the Project Route

















## **H6.2 – Un-Registered Land Notices**

Site notices were given individual reference numbers to differentiate between parcels of land. Some parcels of un-registered land were grouped together with site notices placed in the same location due to their close proximity and availability of safe locations to place and view the site notices. The un-registered land notices were placed in accessible locations to the public such as along a public footpath or road. Further to initial searches of un-registered land, some parcels were then removed from this list due to updates to land registry records, or information obtained from landowners which meant that they did not require un-registered site notices. 
