

Statements of Common Ground

In accordance with government guidance (Planning Act 2008: Pre-application stage for Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects, published 30 April 2024), National Grid has been developing Statements of Common Ground (SoCGs) with a number of statutory prescribed and non-prescribed consultees, statutory undertakers and interested parties during the preparation of the DCO application. The SoCGs seek to identify matters on which parties agree and to track progress towards the resolution of any matters where agreement has not yet been reached.

National Grid has undertaken early preparation of statements with the consultees identified in Table 1.1 below during the pre-application period. Table 1.1 provides a list of those SoCGs currently being developed. Please note this list is subject to change following continued engagement with the consultees.

National Grid will continue to review and develop the SoCGs with the relevant consultees throughout the acceptance, pre-examination and examination stages of the Project. SoCGs will be submitted to the Examining Authority as required during the Examination phase.

Reflecting the various types of consultees and their interests in the application, SoCGs have taken different formats:

- Multiple issue SoCGs for consultees who are interested in multiple disciplines/aspects of the application
- Single issue "letter" SoCGs shorter document used for consultees who have specific areas of focus
- Heads of Terms for more commercially sensitive consultees to outline the position reached by the Parties through engagement to date.

The SoCGs will largely be structured as follows:

- Summary of key engagement undertaken to date with the consultee
- Table(s) summarising the key interests of the Parties (arranged by topic/discipline where relevant) and the status of each matter:
 - 'Not agreed' indicates a final position, where it has not been possible to resolve the issue to the agreement of both parties and there remains a difference of opinion;
 - 'Under discussion' indicates where issues are the subject of active ongoing discussion;
 - 'Agreed' indicates where an issues has been agreed or resolved satisfactorily to the agreement of both parties.

National Grid have been engaging with other statutory prescribed and non-prescribed consultees, statutory undertakers and interested parties during the development of the DCO application. SoCGs with these consultees are unlikely to be produced at this stage for the reasons set out in Table 1.3 below. Please note that while we have been engaging with neighbouring authorities as prescribed consultees throughout project development, we have not sought SoCGs prior to DCO submission, neither has a SoCG been requested by them.
