

Regarding the Examining Authority's note of unaccompanied site inspection (4 of 7) on 14th October 2025, the route did not include Bunwell Hill and specifically, Brick Kiln Lane.

Please could the Planning Inspectorate Examining Authority arrange an accompanied site visit with myself and demand NG's [REDACTED] attends, so that we can look at and compare the different ecological options through this beautiful area. You will be able see for yourselves, the impact that NG's 2025 pylon route will have through this ecologically sensitive area.

The Examining Authority are welcome to come and park at Meadow Wood, Brick Kiln Lane, Bunwell Hill NR16 1SA and I would be happy to show them my concerns about the pylon route.

Brick Kiln Lane is a public road. It is a no through road. Meadow Wood Nature Reserve CWS is private land accessed off Brick Kiln Lane.
