

I am writing in relation to the Norwich to Tilbury transmission project, specifically regarding the proposed placement of pylon TB224 along the A127.

I fully understand the importance of national infrastructure and the need to upgrade our electricity network. However, I am raising a serious concern about the current positioning of this pylon and the direct impact it will have on my home and garden.

As currently proposed, the overhead lines connected to pylon TB224 will run directly across my garden. This will significantly affect not only the enjoyment and use of my property, but also its value and overall environment. The visual intrusion and proximity of such infrastructure to a residential space is deeply concerning.

What I am requesting is both reasonable and minimal: that pylon TB224 is repositioned approximately 10 metres along, so that the lines pass over the adjacent lay-by rather than across my garden, and continue to connect to pylon TB225 from there.

Given the surrounding landscape, which consists of extensive open fields, it is difficult to understand why such a small adjustment cannot be made. This slight alteration would avoid unnecessary impact on my property while still allowing the project to proceed efficiently.

I am not opposing the project as a whole. I am simply asking for a fair and practical adjustment that prevents avoidable harm to my home when there is clearly space and flexibility to do so.

I respectfully urge you to review this matter and consider this minor but important change to the pylon placement.
