I am writing to formally request that a site visit be undertaken to our family home [REDACTED] in direct connection with the Norwich to Tilbury Pylon Project and the recently disclosed underground cable proposals affecting our land.

Given the scale, proximity and cumulative nature of the proposed overhead and underground works, it is essential that the Examining Authority view the site in person. The relationship between the proposed infrastructure and our residential property, farm buildings, grazing land, access routes and surrounding environment cannot be properly understood through plans and written submissions alone.

A site inspection is necessary to fully appreciate:

- The immediate proximity of the proposed works to our home and family dwellings
- The extent of our land directly affected and the fragmentation that would result
- The operational reality of our livery yard, including the daily movement of horses between stables and fields
- Existing drainage patterns and the potential for flooding arising
- The established wildlife habitats that would be disrupted by construction activity and permanent infrastructure

[REDACTED] has been owned and cared for by my parents for over 43 years. It is a long-established family farm and rural business which supports our livelihood and has been intended as a generational legacy. The proposed works would cut directly through land that has been managed and protected for decades, threatening not only its physical integrity but the viability of the farming and livery operations conducted

there.

Significant financial investment has already been made in planning and in maintaining the farm and equestrian facilities. The proposed construction activity — including heavy machinery, trenching and long-term infrastructure installation — would cause extensive disruption to grazing land, create stress and severe risk to horses, and undermine the stability of an established rural enterprise.

The cumulative impact of these proposals is not theoretical; it is immediate and deeply affecting. The ongoing uncertainty and stress associated with the project has had a serious impact on my family, particularly my parents, who are [REDACTED] and who built this farm from the ground up. At a stage in life when they should be enjoying stability and security, they are instead living with prolonged [REDACTED] over the potential loss and fragmentation of their life's work.

It was also deeply concerning to learn, without clear prior communication, that existing pylons behind our property are now proposed to be removed and rerouted underground through our land. This late disclosure materially changes the extent of impact and further reinforces the necessity of a physical inspection of the site.

For all of these reasons, I please consider a site visit to be essential to ensure a fair, informed and evidence-based assessment of the true and cumulative effects of both the overhead pylon project and associated underground works.

Please confirm that this request for a site inspection has been formally recorded.
