Statement of Common Ground

1. Purpose of the Statement of Common Ground

This Statement of Common Ground (SoCG) has been prepared to confirm to the Examining Authority where agreement has been reached and where agreement has not been reached between National Grid, Barrie Stone, Crest Nicholson Operations Ltd and Verde Land Promotions Ltd regarding specific issues arising during construction and/or operation from the interface between the proposed Norwich to Tilbury Project (the Project) and Land to The East and West of Lower Dunton Road Dunton Basildon Essex.

This final version of the SoCG has been submitted at Examination Deadline 7.

2. Parties to the SoCG

This SoCG has been prepared by National Grid (the Applicant) and Barrie Stone, Crest Nicholson Operations Ltd and Verde Land Promotions Ltd.

3. Summary of Matters

This final SoCG deals with 5 matters in total, of which 4 are agreed and 1 remains under discussion.

Discussions between the parties necessarily will continue during detailed design, and for some matters into construction, including on the following matters:

- Final design of the Project, e.g. construction access route and layout areas, the final position of pylons, and the permanent access route
- Site master planning
- Earthing assessment results and, if relevant, mitigation measures
- Construction programme for each party's developments

4. Background

4.1 Description of the Project/Development

National Grid Electricity Transmission plc ('National Grid') owns and maintains the national high voltage electricity transmission network throughout England and Wales. The transmission network connects the power from where it is generated to the regional Distribution Network Operators who then supply businesses and homes.

National Grid holds the Transmission Licence for England and Wales, and its statutory duty is to develop and maintain an efficient, coordinated and economical system of electricity transmission and to facilitate competition in the generation and supply of electricity, as set out in the Electricity Act 1989.

National Grid has developed plans for Norwich to Tilbury (referred to as the 'Project'). The Project would support the UK's net zero target through the connection of new low carbon energy generation in East Anglia and by reinforcing the transmission network.

The Project comprises reinforcement of the transmission network between the existing Norwich Main Substation in Norfolk and Tilbury Substation in Essex, via Bramford Substation, the new East Anglia Connection Node (EACN) Substation and the new Tilbury North Substation.

The reinforcement is needed because the existing transmission network, even with current upgrading, will not have sufficient capacity for the new renewable energy (a substantial proportion of which would be generated by offshore wind) that is expected to connect to the network over the next 10 years and beyond. Completion of the Project, together with other new reinforcements across the country, will meet this future energy transmission demand both in East Anglia and across the UK.

The Project is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP), and National Grid is seeking development consent under statutory procedures set by government. NSIPs are projects of certain types, over a certain size, which are considered by the government to be of national importance, hence permission to build them needs to be given at a national level, by the relevant Secretary of State (in this case the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero). Instead of applying to the local authority for planning permission, the developer must apply to the Planning Inspectorate for a Development Consent Order (DCO) that would grant development consent.

National Grid has submitted an application for development consent to the Planning Inspectorate. The Examining Authority (consisting of five examining inspectors), after a period of public examination, will make their recommendation to the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero, who in turn will decide on whether development consent should be granted for the Project.

The Project is identified as critical to delivering a network which supports the clean power pathways for 2030 delivery.

The Planning Act 2008 places duties on National Grid as the DCO applicant to consult with prescribed or affected persons as well as to take account of responses to consultation and publicity. In accordance with these statutory requirements, National Grid has undertaken two non-statutory and one statutory consultation to inform its proposals, with further targeted consultations.

5. Stakeholder Interests

Barrie Stone is the freeholder of Land to the east and west of Lower Dunton Road. Crest Nicholson Operations Ltd and Verde Land Promotions Ltd have interests that have the potential to interact with the Norwich to Tilbury proposals. This has been identified as Land to the east and west of Lower Dunton Road, Dunton, Basildon, Essex.

Crest Nicholson are promoting residential development on land to the West of Lower Dunton Road – part of which is within the Dunton Hills Garden Village residential allocation under the adopted Brentwood Council Local Plan; and part of which is within the emerging Basildon Local Plan.

The emerging Policy H11 proposes 1,600 – 1,800 dwellings, part of which is located within the Crest Option. The emerging Policy E5 proposes 17.32 Ha for employment uses within use class B8, B2 and E (g) wholly within the Verde Land Promotion option area.

Crest Nicholson Operations Ltd were also granted planning permission on 15 May 2026 (application reference 24/00729/FULL) for: *Redevelopment of the site to provide 146 residential dwellings (Class C3); provision of strategic landscape; provision of new vehicular and pedestrian access routes and associated infrastructure* on land to the East of Lower Dunton Road as the first phase of the wider H11 emerging allocation.

Verde Land Promotions and Crest Nicholson are currently working on a suite of planning applications to be submitted to Basildon Borough Council and Brentwood Council from August 2026 through to October 2027.

7.1	Permanent Loss of Development Footprint	It is agreed that new infrastructure installation by the Applicant would not result in the permanent loss of Crest Nicholson Operations Ltd.'s and Verde Land Promotions Ltd's development footprints, as the Applicant's infrastructure is located outside of the area denoted as residential development by Crest Nicholson Operations Ltd and commercial development by Verde Land Promotions Ltd It is further agreed that any potential indirect effects can be addressed through detailed site master planning, including alignment of layout and key views in response to confirmed pylon locations. 7.2	Temporary Construction Effects – Construction Access and Construction Compound Location	It is agreed that construction access for the Applicant will be taken from the south of the Verde Land Promotions Ltd proposed commercial development site and north of Crest Nicholson Operations Ltd. proposed residential development site via a new haul road installation. This also includes the siting of a construction compound adjacent to the haul road on a temporary basis in location 'A' shown on the plan at Figure 1 below. It is agreed that the southern construction haul road could potentially be used on a shared party basis during the construction programme period, where necessary to facilitate the Applicant's Project delivery and to serve all parties' developments. It is further agreed that the previously proposed northern construction haul road route and the northern construction compound denoted by 'B' in Figure 1 below will no longer be installed. The removal of the northern Construction and Haul Road and adoption of the Southern Construction and Haul Road will happen on the submission of the relevant planning permission by either Crest Nicholson and/or Verde Land Promotions. These arrangements will be secured through Heads of Terms between the parties and reflected in the relevant construction management documentation. It is agreed that the	July 2026

7.3	Operational Effects – Pylon Siting	It is agreed that the position of pylons is established in principle. The Applicant will confirm the final coordinates at the detailed design stage to allow for limited micro-siting. Any such micro-siting will be limited to minor deviations of only a few metres and will remain within the Order Limits and assessed Limits of Deviation, not giving rise to materially new or different environmental effects. 7.4	Permanent Rights	The parties are currently in discussion with regard to the permanent northern overhead line access route being incorporated into Verde Land Promotions Ltd's and Crest Nicholson Operations Ltd.'s development masterplan, and that any potential indirect effects can be appropriately addressed through coordinated and iterative master planning. This masterplan is to be provided by Verde Land Promotions Ltd and Crest Nicholson Operations Ltd.	July 2026

8.1	Modifications to Existing equipment - Earthing	The Applicant has completed an initial earthing screening assessment. This showed further information from Crest Nicholson Operations Ltd and Verde Land Promotions Ltd is required to further review implications at the site. The request for information was sent by the Applicant to Crest Nicholson Operations Ltd and Verde Land Promotions Ltd Nicholson on 29 June 2026. The Applicant will continue to engage with the other parties on the development and the outcomes of the assessment, including any mitigation works required.	The above parties have requested a copy of the initial earthing screening assessment and will provide National Grid with copies of their development masterplan and layout in order to inform further discussions on any issues arising in respect of this technical matter and mitigation measures that may be required to be put in place by National Grid. The parties will require the cost of any earthing reports in respect of the Crest and/or Verde Land developments required by National Grid to be met by National Grid. National Grid will co-operate with the parties in the detailed design work of the Crest and/or Verde Land developments to mitigate any potential impacts against development value.

The parties agree to:

- Commit to engage constructively with other parties in respect of detailed engineering design to facilitate beneficial outcomes for all developments in so far as it relates to overlapping interests
- Develop a shared position statement confirming the ability of the different projects to co-exist and not prejudice the planning consent of other projects
- Commit to update the other parties where material change to their project occurs or is imminently expected

Figure 1 Project alignment at the Crest Nicholson/Verde Land Promotions proposal



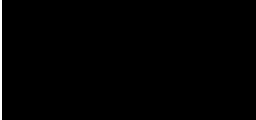
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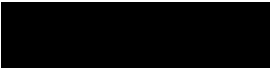

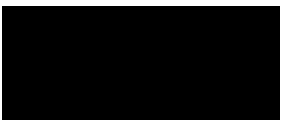
