As a recent local resident of [REDACTED] I am asking on behalf of the local residents that you consider the alternative route of the above proposed development as recently put forward by local MPs and Councils.

Myself and my husband walk on the local nature reserve twice daily with our dog, passing and chatting to many locals and visitors who choose the same route daily. Not only is the area full of local plants, and animals including Herons, Toads, Frogs, butterflies, lizards and buzzards, but also a nice walk away from the wind and sand blizzards from the beach on stormy days.

The dunes and beach across the road also offer the same wonderful walks with unique plants and habitats of many animals. Featuring one of Lancashire's most important sand dune systems, home to over 280 plant species, rare lizards, and hundreds of wintering wading birds.

Taking this away from local residents and tourists for a couple of years would be absolutely heartbreaking. We shouldn't be excluded from what belongs to us.

The traffic is busy now at peak times, without future traffic disruptions from the proposed development - Lytham St Annes will be hit hard.

All we ask is you please consider the alternative proposed route which is cheaper and has less impact on the local wildlife, habitats and residents of Lytham St Annes.
