Even at this stage there are still major issues. And we don't seem to have moved any closer to resolving them

This project in its current form does not make the grade and needs to be denied.

It seems to me that the SOS is hoping that Morgan can be resurrected, but it is not fair on the affected people that have now lived with uncertainty for the last three years and how can you grant compulsory purchase orders for the part of the project that now does not exist whoever takes over if at all would need to negotiate new terms with affected Landowners as Morgans are now void

The applicants have had the NSIP process to prove themselves and they have fallen short and should have been judged on the merits of the DCO that was submitted

Since then, one project was dropped when they didn't get the cfd

That should have been the end

But it seems the desperate push forward for offshore wind is determined to proceed at any cost, that is not the way to engage and take communities with you all you have done is turn people against

We just need the correct decision based on what was put before the NSIP process, not keep delaying the process to give the applicants more time hoping it can be passed. There has got to be a Final Cut off point
