

I am writing, hopefully for the final time, to submit my objections to the proposed windfarm. I am not protesting the windfarm, I am opposing the actual siting of the substations. It has been pointed out time and time again that there is a cheaper, far less environmentally damaging, "oven ready" site at Stannah, but it seems that Morecambe and Morgan are steadfast in their plans to devastate the

Fylde by connecting to the national grid at Penwortham. Not only is this plan going to ruin the livelihood of local farmers and businesses, it will annihilate much of our wildlife, hedgerows and general countryside. Even more concerning though, is that by altering the flight path of thousands of migrating birds, the risk of bird strike will inevitably be increased. BAE have admitted that they cannot mitigate for such events. It is disturbing to read that they are now offering to "work something out" post completion. Our village of Freckleton lost a generation of children when an American bomber crashed onto our village school in 1944. To knowingly increase the risk of another air disaster is absolutely unacceptable. Not only is it irresponsible, but it is also unnecessary, when the alternative route is staring us all in the face.

I hope that the new Secretary of State will agree that the Morecambe and Morgan plans are not worth the unnecessary harm they will cause, and dismiss the application.
