

I understand that local farmers are represented by Masons of Louth as Land Agents and this company are advising their clients and arranging compensation packages for the disruption to their livelihoods but who is the contact of a representative body who will represent and oversee the wellbeing of the local residents of Theddlethorpe with regard to compensation for the breach of the Human Rights Act where a person has the right to a peaceful enjoyment of their property. The Human Rights Act in the UK sets out the principles that the government and public bodies must follow and to date this has been disregarded.

As yet local residents have not been approached nor have they been made aware of the scale of the proposal and how it will affect them living in the village. They have not received any advice from Viking CCS or other impartial advice. I am not aware of anyone receiving guidance from a government or public body who has kept them informed of the progression and to my knowledge, no one has been contacted to be offered compensation for the stress, anxiety, illness and mental health issues that this is causing many residents of Theddlethorpe. I am not aware of any offers to purchase properties of residents who are so frightened by the possible consequences of an "incident" and now wish to relocate but will be prevented from doing so as their property is either now hard to sell or will soon be untenable.

I did place my objection at the very start of this investigation but I have not received a reply or know where to search for any response as the documentation is extensive and the language is difficult to comprehend.
