Notice is hereby given that Esso Petroleum Company, Limited ("Esso") of Ermyn House, Ermyn Way, Leatherhead, Surrey, KT22 8UX intends to apply to the Secretary of State for Business, Energy, and Industrial Strategy for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") under section 37 of the 2008 Act to authorise the construction of an underground aviation fuel pipeline, approximately 90 kilometres in length, from Boorley Green in Hampshire to the West London Terminal storage facility in Hounslow.

The project commences at Boorley Green in Hampshire, before travelling northeast to Alton pumping station, the route of which passes to the northwest of Bishop's Waltham and to the southeast of Four Marks in Hampshire. The project then continues northeast, skirting south of Fleet, travelling through Farnborough, crossing into Surrey and skirting Frimley, before continuing through Chobham and crossing beneath the M3 and M25 motorways as well as the River Thames. The project then continues through Ashford in Surrey and terminates at the West London Terminal storage facility in Hounslow.

Under section 42 and section 47 of the 2008 Act, Esso has a duty to consult the local community and has produced a Statement of Community Consultation which sets out how Esso will undertake its community consultation. Additionally, Esso has a duty to publicise the proposed application under section 48 of the 2008 Act and in line with Regulation 4 of the 2009 Regulations.
