Explanatory note – PLEASE READ

This form is prepared to assist the Examining Authority in considering an application for a Development Consent Order to construct a new tunnel at Stonehenge for traffic on the A303 between Amesbury and Berwick Down.

One impact of the scheme as proposed is that it will convert the current line of the A303 to a restricted byway, prohibiting vehicular traffic. The effect of this is that it will stop up the link between Amesbury byways 11 and 12 ("the Stonehenge Byways"). The Stonehenge byways are shown on the Map at the end of this form. Byway 11 (numbered "3") ee in the south. Byway 12 (numbered "1" and "2") crosses the existing A303 and runs from Durrington in the north to the A360 (Druids Lodge) in the south.

Highways England, the body promoting the application, initially proposed an alternative link between byways 11 and 12 (marked approximately on the Map as a red dotted line). However, this was removed from the application that is currently the subject of examination.

It is very important to maintain the interlinked network of "byways open to all" ensuring that riding can continue with minimal tarmac sections, which is one of the key attractions of visiting this area



Ans: I have used these byways by motorcycle since 2005

Ans: on average about 4-6 times per year

Ans: I use all three routes, and use the short section of the A303 to connect byway 11 and 12. I rarely use the A303 as a point of entry into these byways as I consider it too dangerous for trail motorcycles.

6. Do you use/have you used the Stonehenge Byways alone or in groups or both (if with others, please give details)?

Ans: Both. When I ride in groups I comply with the TRF code where the groups are never larger than six.

7. Please describe the purpose of you use of the Stonehenge Byways and what you enjoy about trail riding (etc.) in this location.

Ans: The purpose is recreation and peaceful enjoyment of the countryside generally. Passing by Stonehenge is always the highlight of any trip. It is also important that free access to the site is available by means of these public rights of way. EH should not be allowed to monopolise access to this World Heritage Site.



8. Do you use the Stonehenge Byways as part of a wider route or circuit (please give details)?

Ans: Yes typically a days circuit would cover around 60-100 miles of byways and minor roads. The Stonehenge byways provide an essential linkage in the network connecting north and south and avoiding dangerous major routes.

9. What would the impact to you be if you were no longer able to use the A303 to access the Stonehenge Byways or to link byway 11 (numbered "3" on the Map) and byway 12 (numbered "1" and "2" on the Map)? If you currently use the byways as part of a wider route or circuit, what would the impact be on that use? (Please provide as much detail as possible.)

Ans: Since the NERC bill the network of unsealed roads available to motorised vehicles has been halved. This has lead to increased use of what remains and pressure on the sustainability of these unsealed roads to the extent that are being subjected to greater levels of damage. This concerns me as a responsible trail rider. Wiltshire Council is using these increased levels of damage as an excuse to apply Traffic Regulation Order to prohibit motorised vehicles and so restricting the right to roam by legitimate recreation users such as myself. Creating a deadend in byway 11 as per the current proposal would increase the pressure on byway 12 and would be used by Wiltshire Council as a reason for closing it to motorised traffic. Having no link would also have the effect of doubling any use of byway 11 by motorised users who would have to travel along it in both directions rather than it being a through route. The lose of these byways would have serious impacts on the sustainability of the byways in this area and loss of enjoyment to many members of the public afforded through their current use and status.

I would use it if offered as the only alternative to the existing A303. However I don't see the point in creating a new route when the section of the A303 could continue to be used as the connecting route. There is no reason to make it a restricted byway and form a new route where there has been no historical route before and potentially disturbing the archaeology along this proposed alternative

11. Do you have any other comments on the proposal to prevent motorised vehicles being able to use the existing line of the A303?

It is totally illogical, particularly for the short section linking the two byways. Motorised traffic will continue to use the byways 11 and 12, which they will share with other users as they have done since time immemorial, there is no reason why the existing line of the A303 could not be shared for all users. EH runs motorised vehicles onto the site at a frequency of one every five minutes so motorised traffic continues within the EH site regardless, motorised vehicles are not being excluded from the site generally, therefore




there is no reason to exclude them on the existing public access routes. The reality is that once the A303 is put into tunnel, EH buses will be the most frequent motorised use of the site and contradict their own stated objectives for the site. Any recreational byway usage will be insignificant by comparison and should be allowed to continue until such time as EH remove all their motorised vehicles from the site.

IF I WERE UNABLE TO USE THE A303 TO ACCESS THE STONEHENGE BYWAYS AND IF I ALSO COULD NOT LINK BYWAY 11 AND 12 ON THE MAP, FOR EXAMPLE IF THE A303 WAS CLOSED TO TRAFFIC AND THERE WAS NO ALTERNATIVE ROUTE JOINING THE BYWAYS, THEN THIS WOULD CAUSE GREAT INCONVENIENCE TO MY TYPICAL RIDE. THE MOST PLEASANT AND ENJOYABLE SECTION OF MY TYPICAL ROUTE WOULD HAVE BEEN REMOVED ENTIRELY.

A FURTHER IMPACT WOULD BE THAT I WOULD BE FORCED ONTO FASTER AND MORE DANGEROUS ROADS. ON MY SMALL MOTORCYCLE I MAY FIND MYSELF UNABLE TO KEEP UP WITH THE TRAFFIC. THESE ROADS CAN BE QUITE INTIMIDATING ON A SMALL CAPACITY MOTORCYCLE AND ARE STATISTICALLY DANGEROUS TO SMALLER MOTORCYCLES.

I COULD ALTER MY JOURNEY BUT IT WOULD BE TO THE DETRIMENT OF MY EXPERIENCE OF THE JOURNEY. I WOULD BE FORCED TO TRAVEL FASTER THAN I WOULD PREFER TO AND IN FAR DENSER AND FASTER MOVING TRAFFIC. I DO NOT UNDERSTAND WHY I SHOULD HAVE TO DO THIS WHEN THESE ROADS AND BYWAYS HAVE BEEN OPEN TO TRAFFIC SINCE I WAS FIRST ISSUED A DRIVING LICENCE AND FURTHERMORE THEY HAVE BEEN AVAILABLE TO PREVIOUS GENERATIONS SINCE TIME IMMEMORIAL.

IF AN ALTERNATIVE BYWAY WAS PROVIDED ALONG THE DOTTED RED LINE, JOINING BYWAYS 11 AND 12, THEN YES I WOULD USE IT. THIS WOULD BE A COMPROMISE AND WOULD ENABLE ME TO CONTINUE TO ENJOY MY TYPICAL JOURNEY IN THE AREA.

THE RED DOTTED LINE WOULD BE AN APPROPRIATE ALTERNATIVE ROUTE AND WOULD REDUCE THE NEGATIVE IMPACT OF THE PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE A303.

THE ABILITY TO TRAVEL ALONG THE RED DOTTED LINE BY MOTORCYCLE WOULD ENABLE ME TO CONTINUE MY JOURNEY, WITHOUT EXPOSING ME TO UNNECESSARY ADDITIONAL RISK, WHILST ALSO ALLOWING ME TO ENJOY THE EXPERIENCE OF RIDING THROUGH THIS AREA. I WOULD BE FULLY SUPPORTIVE OF AN ALTERNATIVE BYWAY LINKING BYWAYS 11 AND 12 AND THE BYWAYS 11 AND 12 REMAINING BYWAYS OPEN TO ALL TRAFFIC.

VIEWING THE STONES FROM THE ROAD IS A WONDERFUL EXPERIENCE THAT WILL BE LOST IF THE A303 IS ALTERED AND MY PERSONAL VIEW IS THAT MOTORISTS SHOULD CONTINUE TO BE ABLE TO USE THE ROUTE OF THE A303 IF THEY CHOOSE TO AS A SCENIC ROUTE.

I UNDERSTAND WHY THIS IS UNLIKELY TO BE ALLOWED AND I BELIEVE THAT IT IS BECAUSE ENGLISH HERITAGE IS TRYING TO MONOPOLISE THE AREA AND MAKE THE VIEWING OF THE STONES FROM A DISTANCE MORE INCONVENIENT, WITH THE OBJECTIVE OF INCREASING THEIR REVENUES FROM THE PUBLIC.

NEVERTHELESS, I FEEL STRONGLY THAT IF THE A303 IS RE-ROUTED AND THE CURRENT ROUTE OF THE A303 IS RESTRICTED TO MOTORVEHICLES THEN AN ALTERNATIVE SHOULD BE PUT IN PLACE TO ALLOW BYWAYS 11 AND 12 TO CONTINUE TO BE USED FOR MOTORISED TRAFFIC.



The experience of riding up Byway 11 and seeing Stonehenge rise up before you is one that takes my breath away every time.

4. How often do you/have you used the routes over that period (if the frequency has varied, please indicate)?

Ans: On average about 3-4 times a year.

5. Do you use both Amesbury byway 11 (numbered "3" on the Map) and byway 12 (numbered "1" and "2" on the Map)? Do you use the A303 to access the routes and/or to provide a link between them (please give details)?

Ans:

Yes. I use both byways, usually heading north up '3', along the A303, then south down '1'. however, I sometimes head north up '2', after the A303 section.



6. Do you use/have you used the Stonehenge Byways alone or in groups or both (if with others, please give details)?

Ans:

I normally ride out for the day with club groups or with my partner or 2 or 3 friends. I also take part in organised charity bike events, weekend bike rally ride-outs and long distance bike routes which often include these lanes.

7. Please describe the purpose of you use of the Stonehenge Byways and what you enjoy about trail riding (etc.) in this location.

Ans:

Wiltshire is a wonderful area where you can still see the green horizon pretty much as it always has been. My partner and I have been exploring this area together for well over thirty years at different times of the year. As motorised long-distance ramblers, we love exploring this area. We use the byways in the Stonehenge area to explore the 'heritage trail' which includes Avebury, Woodhenge, and Sissbury Hill. The activity keeps us fit, physically and mentally, and is a great social activity when we are out with friends. We enjoy visits to the local tea shops and cafes in this area.

8. Do you use the Stonehenge Byways as part of a wider route or circuit (please give details)?

Ans:

Yes. We have a number of routes in this area as we ride all day and may cover 100 miles or so. The byways in this area also sometimes form part of a variable long distance trail that we have ridden called the Trans Euro Trail which attracts people from Europe and all over the UK.

9. What would the impact to you be if you were no longer able to use the A303 to access the Stonehenge Byways or to link byway 11 (numbered "3" on the Map) and byway 12 (numbered "1" and "2" on the Map)? If you currently use the byways as part of a wider route or circuit, what would the impact be on that use? (Please provide as much detail as possible.)

Ans:

It would turn Byway 11 into a dead end and would impact routes that use that byway. The experience of being able to ride past Stonehenge would be lost. Going east to west or vice versa, we would have to make long detours to join the lanes around Berwick St James and the lanes around Boscombe Down.



10. If an alternative byway was provided as shown by the dotted red line on the Map would you use it? Do you have any other comments on such an alternative?

Yes, I would use it. Indeed, it would be better than the situation now as riders would avoid the heavy traffic on the current A303.

11. Do you have any other comments on the proposal to prevent motorised vehicles being able to use the existing line of the A303?

It would make the most sense to turn the existing line of the A303 into a Byway, rather than a Restricted Byway, but put a permanent TRO on it limiting use to vehicles with no more than two wheels. This would prevent car drivers using it as a short-cut, prevent 4x4 users damaging it and prevent travellers setting up home on it. This has been done to several byways in Hampshire with great success.


The alternative byway, referred to above, is the next best thing.



The byways provide an enjoyable, safe, and sustainable link between two important and valued areas for trail riding, namely Salisbury Plain and the Bourne Valley. Byway 12 also provides an off-tarmac link to Berwick St. James, where a farm shop aside a byway is particularly welcoming of passing trail riders.

I will usually stop at Stonehenge if I am leading a group of motorcyclists who have not seen the monument before as most will want a photograph of themselves with it.

Byway 11 has a character unlike any other byway in the county, with the section undamaged by agricultural use north of Springbottom Farm having great amenity value, both as somewhere to rest mid-ride and through the view of Stonehenge as you approach from the south.

8. Do you use the Stonehenge Byways as part of a wider route or circuit (please give details)?

Often. Byway 12 leads to the Wylye Valley where I either follow the historic drove roads from Salisbury to Shaftesbury, or further into Dorset during the longer days of summer. Sometimes this has taken my fellow travellers and I as far as the Isle of Purbeck or Weymouth.

Byway 11 leads to the Bourne Valley via the safe backroads of the Woodford Valley. The Bourne Valley is home to several fords where I must have taken scores of photos.

At the southern end of these fords is a stunning Roman Road between Old Sarum and Winchester, which is unsealed as far as Broughton in the Test Valley. I use this byway as part of a longer route to Basingstoke and will stop for lunch in Stockbridge, which is home to several good pubs.

I have guided groups of motorcyclists on the byways at Stonehenge during the 'Wessex Wanderer' event promoted by Wiltshire TRF and the 'Great Christmas Escape' promoted by Burbidge's Bakery, and (as 'Linesman' responsible for the UK route) intentionally included them in the Trans Euro Trail on account of their safety and amenity value to touring motorcyclists.



9. What would the impact to you be if you were no longer able to use the A303 to access the Stonehenge Byways or to link byway 11 (numbered "3" on the Map) and byway 12 (numbered "1" and "2" on the Map)? If you currently use the byways as part of a wider route or circuit, what would the impact be on that use? (Please provide as much detail as possible.)

I intentionally use byways 11 & 12 from their extreme northern and southern ends in order to maximise my enjoyment of using them and reduce road risk.

Not having a link open to motorcycles between byways 11 and 12 would be detrimental to my safety and that of the people riding with me because the alternative road route enables vehicles to have a road speed greater than our own (typically 50mph). The small road space occupied by trail motorcycles makes us ripe for being overtaken in a dangerous manner, with cars often cutting in front of us when we travel in a group (typically 4-6 riders).

A longer byway route between Salisbury Plain and Old Sarum exists via the Bulfod Ranges, though as public access to these is controlled by the MOD they cannot be said to be a reliable alternative, and are certainly not as sustainable as the byways at Stonehenge.

10. If an alternative byway was provided as shown by the dotted red line on the Map would you use it? Do you have any other comments on such an alternative?

Yes I would, though I would prefer a link between byways 11 and 12 on the course of the A303. The width of the carriageway here is such that part of it could be grassed over to improve equine amenity whilst retaining a more modest section for motorcycle use.

It's hard to think the 'vision' of a vehicle-free World Heritage Site contained within the World Heritage Site management plan to be anything but an attempt by its authors to establish a financial monopoly at Stonehenge.

I worry that the safety of motorcyclists – statistically the most vulnerable road user group – is being negated by people who don't understand our needs.








Sample of track log with use date


The alternative byway is totally unsuitable and will force me to use the A303 which will increase the risk to both me and my trail riding group. The risk of a serious accident is significantly increased.



Route used for Bakerman charity ride



Ans: As a native of Salisbury, this would mean that I would have to traverse the A303, A345 or A338 to access byways north of Stonehenge. This would be hugely increase journey times using a typical small engine capacity motorcycle used for the purpose of trail riding, as well as having to share these busy A-roads with faster moving and much larger vehicles such as articulated trucks. Removing access to the A303 or a link route, would increase the risk to motorcyclists.

10. If an alternative byway was provided as shown by the dotted red line on the Map would you use it? Do you have any other comments on such an alternative?

Yes, I suggested a similar link route as an alternative to a proposed traffic regulation order to close the byways by Wiltshire Council and English Heritage several years ago. I was pleased to see it included in plans by Highways England on display at Salisbury Guildhall for the Stonehenge tunnel plans. (Where incidentally Highways England staff



stated that there were - no - plans to curtail vehicular access on the byways). Quite why it was removed from the current proposals remains a mystery.



If the A303 was designated a 'restricted byway' to protect Stonehenge stones from damage due to the A303 traffic, there is no similar traffic-based evidence that the byways in existence for 100s of years already should also be.

Temporary re-routing of the byways during tunnel construction are expected, but not permanent closure of these ancient rights of way. During construction works I would adopt alternative routes to still travel through the locale on byways.

In addition to permitting sections of travel to be linked without difficulty, the northern part of Byway 12 allows one to stop for a break within sight of Stonehenge, which is a far safer place from which to see it than many drivers practice by slowing down on the A303 to gawp at it and causing unnecessary congestion.

Ans: These two byways are integrated into a day's riding as part of the local network of byways covering Salisbury Plain and the area to the south of the A303.

9. What would the impact to you be if you were no longer able to use the A303 to access the Stonehenge Byways or to link byway 11 (numbered "3" on the Map) and byway 12 (numbered "1" and "2" on the Map)? If you currently use the byways as part of a wider route or circuit, what would the impact be on that use? (Please provide as much detail as possible.)

Ans: Losing the north-south crossing point would add considerable additional travel along an extremely busy road on motorcycles that do not travel at the same speed as the majority of the traffic using said road. In addition to the inconvenience of being denied access to this point, there is a safety aspect to bring into consideration. Travelling along the A303 on an off-road motorcycle with a comfortable cruising speed that is 10mph slower than the speed limit for trucks is not a pleasant experience at the best of times on the dual carriageway sections of the road. The area in question is only single carriageway, giving vehicles much less space, and the presence of Stonehenge adds a considerable distraction to drivers already paying insufficient attention to their task.



10. If an alternative byway was provided as shown by the dotted red line on the Map would you use it? Do you have any other comments on such an alternative?

The dotted red line on the map is nothing more than a form of appeasement and adds nothing to what we can already do, rendering Byway 11 and the southern part of Byway 12 a separate loop from terrain to the north of the A303. I would only be likely to use this if planning a route exclusively to the south of the A303 and not considering crossing it to the northern side.

I feel I must highlight that I am in my late forties and respect the many and varied users of BOATs and am passionate in ensuring that we, the public; respect the right to access these BOATs regardless of whether walking, horse riding or biking. 




