I have considered the <u>report of the Advisory Mission</u>. I agree with main principal finding, i.e. that the proposed scheme would have an adverse impact on the OUV of the WHS and that a southern bypass should be further explored.

The Mission admitted that at the very least the western limit of the tunnel should be extended to the WHS boundary.

It seems to me that National Highways has simply reiterated many of the arguments it has raised previously to justify a scheme which has been judged as clearly unacceptable to many parties including the Government's independent specialist examiners, the former Transport Secretary, and UNESCO's World Heritage Committee..

I note that the High Court judgment quashed the DCO partly because the Transport Secretary had not given proper consideration to alternatives.

I believe that National Highways' response fails to seriously address any of the above problems.

I continue to object to the proposals and hope that the scheme will be abandoned. Should the Transport Secretary intend to proceed with the scheme, I hope that there will be another formal public examination so that the new information submitted by National Highways and others since 2020 can fully discussed, and taken into account by the Independent Planning Inspectorate.
