Notice is hereby given that **Highways England Company Limited** ("Highways England") of Bridge House, Walnut Tree Close, Guildford, GU1 4LZ proposes to make an application ("the Application") to the Secretary of State for Transport under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 for a Development Consent Order.

The Application relates to a comprehensive upgrade of the M42 junction 6, near Birmingham Airport, allowing better movement of traffic on and off the A45, supporting access to the airport and preparing capacity for the new HS2 station.

The project is situated wholly in the Metropolitan Borough of Solihull in the West Midlands and is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) under Sections 14 and 22 of the Planning Act 2008.

The scheme's main proposals in summary are:

- A new 1.5 mile (2.4 km) dual carriageway link road between the Clock Interchange on the A45 and a new junction on the M42, north of the Solihull Road, allowing traffic travelling northbound to exit the M42 and traffic travelling southbound to join the M42.
- The new dual carriageway would be to the west of Bickenhill and would generally be below ground level and pass beneath the B4438 (Catherine de Barnes Lane), at both the north west and south west corners of Bickenhill.
- Improvements will be made to the Clock Interchange and the A45 between the Clock Interchange and the M42, including potential improvements to non-motorised user routes.
- Free flow links will be provided around the north west and the north east of the M42 junction 6.
- Improvements will also be included on the south east side of the M42 junction 6, the A45 westbound (east of the M42 junction 6) and the M42 junction 6 southbound slip roads to improve the performance around this quadrant of the junction.

## German far-right MP facing race crime inquiry over tweet

A German far-right MP is being investigated after she accused Cologne police of being "barbaric, gang-raping Muslim hordes of men".

Beatrix von Storch, the deputy leader of Alternative for Germany (AfD), was also temporarily suspended from Twitter and Facebook as a new law forcing social media companies to remove hate speech came into force in Germany on 1 January.

Social media firms face fines of up to €50m (£44m) if they do not remove "obviously illegal" hate speech and other postings within 24 hours of receiving a notification.

Police tweeted the new year message in several languages, including English and French as well as Arabic. It said: "Cologne police wishes everyone in the metropolitan area of Cologne and Leverkusen and everywhere else, of course, a Happy New Year!"

The authorities are considering whether Von Storch should be charged with incitement to hatred, which is a criminal offence.

Critics of the social media law, which was conceived by the Social Democrat-run justice ministry, say it will place censorship decisions that require legal training at the whim of technology companies.

Questions have been raised as to whether sites such as Twitter will hire enough trained moderators to cope with the expected influx of deletion requests.

Digital rights activists, technology companies and political groups, including the pro-business Free Democratic party, the Left party and the AfD, have been vocal critics of the new law.

Tweeting after her 12-hour ban, Von Storch - who posed with the former UKIP leader Nigel Farage when he endorsed AfD's election campaign in September - posted: "Facebook has now also censored me. This is the end of the constitutional state."

Cologne's state prosecutor said yesterday that it had received "several hundred" criminal complaints against Von Storch.

If she were charged and found guilty of incitement to hatred she could face a fine or a prison sentence of up to three years in Germany.

A police spokesman told Der Spiegel the investigation into the inflammatory

tweets was normal procedure. "If there's a suspicion that we are dealing with a crime, it is our legal responsibility to act," he said.

Von Storch, whose grandfather served as finance minister under Hitler, previously provoked outrage in 2016 when she answered "yes" to a question on Facebook asking whether firearms should be used against women and children trying to cross the German border.

She later claimed that her computer mouse had slipped.

A tweet from another AfD MP, Alice Weidel, the party's joint leader in the Bundestag, was also blocked by Twitter.

She criticised Von Storch's ban, saying: "Our authorities submit to imported, marauding, groping, beating, knife-stabbing migrant mobs."

During New Year's Eve celebrations in Cologne in 2016, scores of women were sexually assaulted and mugged by large groups of men.

Police said the suspects were largely of north African origin and that most had recently migrated to Germany.

## No radar, no lights and no loo: it's just plain sailing on a slow boat to China

Fierce monsoons and razor-edged reefs have proved deadly for Filipino seafarers for centuries, but there are more modern dangers lurking in the ocean for a crew of adventurers planning to sail the 600 miles to China in boats made using techniques that date to AD200.

"My greatest fear is to sail at night, because you can be run over by big ships," said Arturo Valdez, 69, who is leading the mission. Without advanced navigation equipment, the only way his team will spot oil tankers is with their eyes. "We cannot even be seen on their radar because we are made of wood."

Valdez heads a crew of about 30 who plan to leave Manila this spring in three 18-metre boats called balangays made of hardwood planks, colourful sails and just a small roofed area as shade from the sun. The round trip will take about a month, and there is no toilet on board.

The balangays were made by boatbuilders from the southern Philippines using skills passed down the generations. The crew plans to recreate historical trade and migration routes in commemoration of a journey launched in 1417 by the Filipino sultan Paduka Batara, who set sail to pay tribute to Ming dynasty rulers.

Though the sultan made it to China, he fell ill and died. His wife and children remained and were granted land and citizenship, and thousands of their descendants remain there to this day.

Valdez hopes his voyage will be luckier than the sultan's. To stay on course, he has enlisted the help of locals

skilled in navigating by the stars. Many of the team are mountaineers who led an expedition to Mount Everest, including Carina Dayonon, one of the first three Filipinas to reach the summit. Valdez and his team have tested the balangays. In 2009, they made a 17-month journey across south-east Asia, sailing from island to island and dropping anchor at night. "If there was no wind we had to paddle our way. There was no communication and we did not stray too far from the coastline," he said. "We asked fishermen which is the best way to go. It was just to prove that in my DNA I am a seafarer."

At one point, a monsoon storm blew the crew off course and they were afraid of being taken hostage in the southern Philippines, where kidnapping for

ransom remains a lucrative business. "It was a matter of instinct - there were some close calls," he said.

Valdez has rarely been lost on his previous trips, but the forthcoming South China Sea leg will be more difficult because the crew will have to cross expanses of ocean.

It will be his third attempt to reach China. He tried to get there in a balangay from Vietnam in 2010, but the wind changed course, and a second trip was cancelled this summer after dangerous gales in the northern Philippines.

To Valdez's dismay, regulations in Chinese ports mean that for this trip they will have to carry some modern equipment as one of the three boats must have a motor, lights and radio. "I think this trip will be the last of its kind because you are not allowed to go to Hong Kong or Singapore unless you have the modern amenities that can communicate with port authorities," said Valdez.

The crew was fortunate that politics did not get in the way of their plans, he added. The Philippines and China are embroiled in a territorial dispute over parts of the South China Sea, which is rich in fisheries and crossed by vital global shipping lanes. To assert its power, Beijing has built military bases fitted with missile launchers on islands also claimed by Manila.

Those military installations are not on Valdez's route. "We don't get involved in politics," he said. "It is a cultural voyage."

"These waters in south-east Asia unified all the peoples," he added. "And I think, in a way, that's the message of this entire voyage."
