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1. Introduction

1.1 Purpose of this document

- 1.1.1 This Statement of Common Ground ("SoCG") has been prepared in respect of the application ("the Application") for the M25 junction 28 improvement scheme ("the Scheme") submitted by Highways England Company Limited ("Highways England") to the Secretary of State ("Secretary of State") for a Development Consent Order ("the Order") under section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 ("PA 2008).
- 1.1.2 This SoCG does not seek to replicate information which is available elsewhere within the Application documents. All documents are available in the deposit locations and/or Planning Inspectorate website.
- 1.1.3 The SoCG has been produced to confirm to the Examining Authority where agreement has been reached between the parties to it, and where agreement has not (yet) been reached. SoCGs are an established means in the planning process of allowing all parties to identify and so focus on specific issues that may need to be addressed during the examination.

1.2 Parties to this Statement of Common Ground

- 1.2.1 This SoCG has been prepared by (1) Highways England as the Applicant and (2) Eastern Power Networks.
- 1.2.2 Highways England became the Government-owned Strategic Highways Company on 1 April 2015. It is the highway authority in England for the strategic road network and has the necessary powers and duties to operate, manage, maintain and enhance the network. Regulatory powers remain with the Secretary of State. The legislation establishing Highways England made provision for all legal rights and obligations of the Highways Agency, including in respect of the Application, to be conferred upon or assumed by Highways England.
- 1.2.3 Highways England understands that Eastern Power Networks plc (Eastern Power Networks) is a subsidiary company of UK Power Networks Holdings Limited (UKPN). It is understood that EPN cover the licencing for the area in which the Scheme falls, however, UKPN remain the parent company. To date Highways England has had and continues to have detailed discussions with UKPN as the distribution network operator.

1.3 Terminology

- 1.3.1 In Table 3-1 in the Issues section of this SoCG:
 - "Agreed" indicates area(s) of agreement
 - "Under discussion" indicates area(s) of current disagreement where resolution remains possible, and where parties continue discussing the issue to determine whether they can reach agreement by the end of the examination



- "Not agreed" indicates a final position for area(s) of disagreement where the resolution of divergent positions will not be possible, and parties disagree on this point.
- 1.3.2 It can be taken that any matters not specifically referred to in the Issues chapter of this SoCG are not of material interest or relevance to Eastern Power Networks, and therefore have not been the subject of any discussions between the parties. As such, those matters can be read as agreed, only to the extent that they are either not of material interest or relevance to Eastern Power Networks.



2. Record of engagement

- 2.1.1 A summary of the meetings and correspondence that has taken place between Highways England and Eastern Power Networks in relation to the Application is outlined in Table 2-1.
- 2.1.2 Reference has been made within the Statement of Common Ground to UK Power Networks (UKPN). Eastern Power Networks (EPN) are understood to be part of UK Power Networks and as such, correspondence with UK Power Networks is also included in this Statement of Common Ground.

3. Issues

3.1 Introduction and general matters

- 3.1.1 This section sets out the 'issues' which are agreed, not agreed, or are under discussion between the Eastern Power Networks and Highways England. On 12 November 2020, the Examining Authority issued a letter under Section 88 of the Planning Act 2008 and Rules 4, 6 and 9 of The Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010 (known as the 'Rule 6 Letter'). Annex D sets out a request for Statements of Common Ground (SoCG) between Highways England and various parties, including Eastern Power Networks. For the Eastern Power Networks, the 'Rule 6 Letter' advises that the following issues should be in the SoCG:
 - The effects on existing services, apparatus and infrastructure
 - Protective Provisions contained within the draft DCO
 - The provisions set out in section 127 of the Planning Act 2008
 - Table 3-1 shows those matters which have been agreed or yet to be agreed
 by the parties, including a reference number for each matter, and the date
 and method by which it was agreed (if relevant).
