The Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 Regulation 13: Duty to publicise

I am writing with reference to the M25 junction 10/A3 Wisley interchange improvement scheme. This is to notify you that Highways England is proposing to make an application to the Secretary of State for a Development Consent Order (DCO) under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 ("the Act"). We will be undertaking statutory pre-application consultations on our proposals from 12 February 2018 until 26 March 2018. In accordance with Section 42 of the Act, Highways England, as the prospective applicant, must consult with you about the proposed application. This is because you are a body prescribed in Schedule1 of the Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009 (as amended) and/or have been identified by the Planning Inspectorate as a consultation body for the purposes of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017.

In summary, the proposed scheme will include measures to upgrade the existing roundabout at M25 junction 10, widen the A3 between the Painshill and Ockham junctions and convert the existing hard shoulder on the M25 to provide an additional running lane on the M25 through junction 10. We also propose to widen the A245 Byfleet Road at Painshill and to improve crossings and facilities for pedestrians, cyclists and horse-riders. To improve safety, the scheme will also involve some alterations to connecting side roads, including to Wisley Lane and to a number of private access arrangements. A comprehensive package of environmental mitigation and compensation measures will be incorporated within the scheme proposals. A preferred route announcement for the scheme was made on 29 November 2017.

The scheme meets the thresholds for a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project as defined in the Act. As a result we are required to submit an application for a DCO to the Secretary of







State for Transport through the Planning Inspectorate (PINS). Information about the Act, the DCO process and the role of PINS can be found on the PINS website: www.gov.uk/government/organisations/planning-inspectorate (follow the links on National infrastructure applications).

I wish to draw your attention to the fact that the scheme will be an Environmental Impact Assessment development, as defined by the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. This means that the proposed works will constitute development for which an Environmental Impact Assessment will be required. An Environmental Statement will therefore be submitted as part of the application and our Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR) will be published as part of the consultation materials. To facilitate construction of the proposed scheme, our DCO application may need to seek powers for the compulsory acquisition of land and/or rights over land. This statutory consultation is therefore an important opportunity for you to have your say. We strongly encourage you to provide your feedback to us now through this consultation process before our proposals are finalised and submitted to the Planning Inspectorate for examination.

As part of the DCO process we are required to identify and consult people with an interest in the land that might be affected. We have therefore commissioned a specialist land referencing company called TerraQuest to identify and confirm all relevant land interests that might potentially be affected. As part of that exercise, you should have already received (by separate letter) a questionnaire from TerraQuest asking you to confirm your interests and providing you with plans showing what we believe to be the extent of your interests and the land that might be affected. 
