## Dear Colin Wright,

Thank you for your correspondence of the 21 November regarding the Lower Thames Crossing (LTC). We acknowledge receipt of your earlier correspondence on this matter and can confirm that it was directed to the Roads and Project Infrastructure Delivery Directorate for consideration. The Secretary of State for Transport receives a large amount of correspondence, and I hope you will appreciate that is it not possible for them to personally review or reply to each one individually.

As stated in our earlier responses, the Department and National Highways have been through a lengthy selection process to identify and assess potential locations for LTC. The proposed route was considered the best balance between meeting the scheme objectives and impacting the environment and local communities.

The total amount spent on the planning process for LTC is £295.1 million, covering the period from April 2017 to December 2023. This includes the development of LTC's first Development Consent Order (DCO) application through to the end of the examination period.

As you are aware, the application from National Highways for a DCO for the LTC is a live planning application currently with the Department for a decision.

A report and recommendation were submitted by the Examining Authority to the Department on 20 March 2024. Following a Written Ministerial Statement issued on 7 October 2024, the deadline for a decision on this application has been extended to 23 May 2025. This is to allow more time for the application to be considered further, including any decisions made as part of the spending review.
