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1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Purpose

1.1.1 This Progress with Statements of Common Ground document relates to an application made by Highways England (the “Applicant”) to the Planning Inspectorate under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 for a Development Consent Order (a “DCO”). If made the DCO would grant consent for the Applicant to undertake the A585 Windy Harbour to Skippool Improvement Scheme (the “Scheme”). A detailed description of the Scheme can be found in the Environmental Statement: Chapter 2 (document reference TR010035/APP/6.2).

1.1.2 This document has been prepared and submitted in compliance with Regulation 5(2)(q) of the Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009 which state:

“The application must be accompanied by ... any other documents considered necessary to support the application”

1.1.3 This Statement has been prepared to provide the Examining Authority (ExA) with the current position on Statements of Common Ground (SoCG) between the Applicant and prescribed consultees, statutory undertakers and interested parties in relation to the Scheme.

1.1.4 Highways England intends to continue working with all of the relevant parties during the Examination stages to further develop the SoCGs and seek agreement on the issues presented within them.

1.2 Structure

1.2.1 This report is structured as follows:

- Section 2 outlines the structure of each SoCG document and provides a list of the parties that Highways England is seeking to develop a SoCG with
- Section 3 provides an update on the status of each SoCG with the intention that this document will be updated during the Examination at each of the deadlines

2 STRUCTURE AND STATUS OF STATEMENTS OF COMMON GROUND

2.1 Structure of each Statement of Common Ground

2.1.1 Each SoCG adopts a consistent and standard format to provide clarity to other parties and ultimately the ExA. Each SoCG is structured in the following way:

- **Section 1** introduces the SoCG, provides a description of its purpose and the terminology used therein and states the role of each party (e.g. Natural England) in the process
- **Section 2** provides a tabular record of the engagement that has occurred with the party during the Pre-Application phase and following submission of the DCO application, for example discussions regarding baseline data or the suitability of mitigation measures
- **Section 3** is subdivided into a series of tables summarising key issues and the position of the Applicant, the relevant party that the SoCG relates to and the status of that issue (agreed, under discussion or not agreed)
- **Appendices** to each SoCG provide further information and context for the matters described in the respective documents

2.2 Status of Statements of Common Ground

2.2.1 The Applicant commenced the preparation of the SoCGs during the pre-application phase and has continued to refine and agree their contents during the Pre-Examination phase. This process will continue during Examination. Table 2-1 lists the SoCGs that the Applicant is in the process of preparing which also reflects the list of SoCGs within the Rule 6 Letter issued on 12 March 2019 and the Rule 8 Letter issued 16 April 2019.
