Further to yesterday's Preliminary Meeting and first Open Meeting, the Joint Councils of Queen Camel, Sparkford and West Camel would like to extend an open invitation to the Examining Authority Team to take part in a brief series of accompanied visits in order that they view, first hand, some of the local road congestion and accident black-spots in the three villages.

Our intention would be to visit **Sparkford** High Street, **Queen Camel** High Street and Camel Bridge (weight restricted), Countess Gytha Primary/Junior school on West Camel Road as well as **West Camel**, Parsonage Rd crossroads (accident black-spot), Howell Hill, and Plowage junctions with the A303.

Although this appears to be quite a long list, a visit should take no more than a couple of hours altogether.

It is, however, quite important that these sites are seen during peak commuting times i.e. < 08:30 or after 15:00.
