Thank you for your letter dated 5 October 2022 and received by Natural England on the same date. Please accept my apologies for missing the deadline of 12 October.

Natural England is satisfied with the response provided by the Applicant in their response to the SoS questions (ref:9.38) with regard to otters but wishes to clarify the point made in their response to question 2:

It is the responsibility of the scheme and their ecologist to make the case as to whether or not actions will impact otters to the extent that wildlife legislation would be breached in absence of a licence.

In cases where this is likely, an applicant should apply for the relevant licence, in this case an EPS licence and provide to Natural England in good time.

Where a scheme and their ecologist are satisfied that actions will not impact otters to the extent that wildlife legislation would be breached, Natural England does not typically comment on method statements which rely on reasonable avoidance measures or sensitive working practices, as these are the applicant's own legal risk to justify, and are not licensable.

In this case, Natural England Wildlife Licensing Service have not been approached by the Ecological Consultant under the Discretionary Advice Service to look at providing advice or a Letter Of No Impediment for their working methods regarding otters. We therefore presume that the applicant is satisfied that actions will not impact otters to the extent that a licence would be required.
