Draft Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC)

Under section 47(1) of the Planning Act 2008, the Applicant of a Development Consent Order (DCO) application must prepare a statement setting out how they propose to consult people living in the vicinity of the land about the proposed application. Section 47(2) of the Planning Act 2008 states we must consult local authorities whose land is within the proposed development.

We are required to set out in our Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC) how we propose to consult those living in the vicinity of the proposed application. It should act as a framework for the community consultation generally, for example, setting out where details and dates of any events will be published.

This SoCC is a draft intended for consultation with Coventry City Council, Rugby Borough Council and Warwickshire County Council in order for them to provide feedback on the proposed community consultation. In accordance with Section 47(2) of the Act, formal response is required within a 28-day consultation period.



1 About us

- 1.1 National Highways operate, <u>maintain</u> and improve England's motorways and major A-roads, which form the strategic road network (SRN). The A46 Coventry Junctions (Walsgrave) ("the Scheme") is a critical part of our ongoing investment, and will improve journeys between East and West Midlands, which is important for the local and regional economy.
- 1.2 We are sharing this draft SoCC to outline our approach to consulting with the local community for the above Scheme. It provides details about how you (the local community) can take part in the consultation and how feedback will be used to influence our proposed design.
- 1.3 To make sure we approach our consultation in the very best way for the local community, we are consulting on this document with Coventry City Council, Warwickshire County Council and Rugby Borough Council, which are the local authorities in the areas in which the Scheme is proposed to be built.
- 1.4 This document also provides background to the Scheme and how the application to construct it will progress.

2 DCO Application

- 2.1 The Scheme is considered to be a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) and therefore we are required to follow the requirements of the Planning Act 2008, which means we will publish this SoCC in fulfilment of Section 47 ("duty to consult local community") of that Act.
- 2.2 Under the Planning Act 2008, we are required to make an application to the Secretary of State through the Planning Inspectorate for a Development Consent Order (DCO) to construct this Scheme. The Planning Inspectorate will examine our application and the Secretary of State will decide whether the Scheme should go ahead based on a recommendation made by The Planning Inspectorate. Our DCO application for the scheme will be submitted after we have considered the consultation responses and further developed the Scheme proposals to respond to the consultation responses where appropriate. - 2.3 A key consideration for the Planning Inspectorate and the Secretary of State when assessing our DCO application is the National Networks National Policy Statement (NNNPS). The NNNPS sets out the need for development of road projects on the national networks and is the policy against which decisions on major road projects will be made.
- 2.4 When we submit our application, the Planning Inspectorate on behalf of the Secretary of State must consider whether our consultation has been adequate. The best time for you to have your say to inform our final design on this Scheme is now by taking part in this consultation.

3 The Scheme

- 3.1 In March 2020, the government's Road Investment Strategy 2: 2020-2025 (RIS2) included a commitment for National Highways to improve the A46 'Trans-Midlands Trade Corridor' between the M5 and the Humber Ports, to create a continuous dual carriageway from Lincoln to Warwick.
- 3.2 The Scheme involves the upgrade of two at-grade junctions (Binley and Walsgrave) to provide relief from traffic congestion and to improve journey times by increasing the capacity on the A46 between the M6 and the M40. This will benefit both the strategic and local traffic needs and support future growth forecasts from Coventry City Council.
- 3.3 Construction of the A46 Binley junction improvement scheme was completed in February 2023, converting this junction from an at-grade signalised roundabout to a grade separated junction. The Binley scheme did not require a DCO and was progressed via a Highways Act Order.
- 3.4 The A46 Coventry Junctions (Walsgrave), is currently an at-grade three arm roundabout on the A46 Coventry Eastern bypass, situated between the Binley and M6/M69 junctions. The Walsgrave junction provides a connection between the SRN and the Local Road Network via the A46 and B4082 respectively.
- 3.5 We are proposing to improve the A46 Coventry Junctions (Walsgrave) junction by providing the following:
 - A grade separated junction approximately 0.8km to the north of the existing roundabout location
 - · Re-alignment of the dual carriageway through the existing junction
 - A single lane carriageway connecting the new junction to the B4082
 - Environmental mitigation
 - Diversion of utilities
- 3.6 In addition, any necessary rights and powers will be sought to ensure delivery of the Scheme, including permanent and temporary compulsory acquisition (if required)
- 3.7 The aims of the Scheme are to:
 - improve safety
 - support the growing economy
 - · support the smooth flow of traffic
 - increase capacity
 - relieve congestion



4 Preliminary Environmental Information

- 4.1 The Scheme is an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) development in accordance with the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 and therefore, we are carrying out an EIA for the Scheme. We are publishing a Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR), which is the first main output of the EIA process. The consultation will be supported by a Non-Technical Summary (NTS) of the PEIR as part of the consultation materials. This gives information about the potential environmental effects of the Scheme, the potential measures proposed to avoid, reduce and mitigate those effects in order to facilitate well-informed responses to the consultation. The PEIR has been developed based on initial assessments completed to date. The PEIR and the NTS will be available online or to view at deposit locations listed in Section 9 below. An Environmental Statement will be submitted with the DCO application.
- 4.2 Additional information about the proposed Scheme and its associated benefits, including detailed maps/plans, will be included in our public consultation brochure. Copies of the brochure will be available at local deposit locations detailed in this SoCC during the consultation period and on the Scheme webpage: https://nationalhighways.co.uk/our-roads/west-midlands/a46-coventry-junctions-upgrade/

5 Consulting the community and previous consultations

- 5.1 We have already carried out one round of public consultation from January to February 2022 where we consulted on our proposed options for the Scheme design.
- 5.2 Prior to that consultation, we undertook further assessments, which found that only one of our four shortlisted options delivered the required improvements at Walsgrave junction.
- 5.3 Consultees were asked for their views on one route option (Option 11) and whether they had any concerns in relation to the Scheme. The feedback received during the consultation showed support for improvements at Walsgrave junction and support for Option 11.
- 5.4 Following the options consultation, Option 11 was announced as the preferred route in June 2022. More details, including the results of this consultation and how we decided to progress Option 11 are included in the Staged Overview of Assessment Report (SOAR), the Report on Public Consultation (contained as appendix C of the SOAR) and the preferred route announcement leaflet, available to download from https://nationalhighways.co.uk/our-roads/west-midlands/a46-coventry-junctions-upgrade/.
- 6 Pre-application statutory consultation why and when
- 6.1 It is important to us that our consultation will:
 - Enable members of the public, residents, local interest groups and businesses to understand and influence our proposals;

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- Provide the opportunity to give feedback on proposed design;
- Encourage the community to help shape our proposals to maximise local benefits and minimise the potential local impact of the Scheme;
- Help local people understand the potential nature and local impact of our proposals;
- Enable potential mitigation measures to be considered and, if appropriate, built into the project before an application is submitted; and
- Identify ways in which our proposals, without significant costs, can support wider strategic or local objectives.
- 6.2 Your comments will help us achieve these objectives. We will listen to everyone's views and we'll consider your opinions, amending our proposals where necessary and possible in line with feedback before we submit the DCO application.
- 6.3 We plan to hold a 6-week consultation starting in approximately late-October until early-December 2023. During the consultation period, we will be consulting on the following particular elements of the scheme:
 - · Development of the preliminary design since the preferred route announcement
 - Environmental mitigation measures
 - Emerging arrangements for the construction stage of the scheme
 - · Opportunities for non-motorised users
- 6.4 Working with Coventry City Council, Rugby Borough Council and Warwickshire County Council, we have developed a consultation distribution area (Consultation Zone), which shows properties that will receive consultation information by post. This is based on who we think is most likely to be interested or affected by our proposals. We will also carry out supplementary engagement methods, including newspaper adverts and social media, which would extend well beyond the postal distribution area.




Figure 1: Consultation Zone - Consultation distribution for posted information

- 11.1 We'll record and carefully consider all responses received during the consultation which will be taken into account in finalising our DCO application before we submit it to the Planning Inspectorate.
 - 11.2 We'll summarise our findings in the Consultation Report which forms part of our DCO application.
 - 11.3 If we consider that further information is required after this consultation, we may undertake further engagement with stakeholders to address specific matters.
 - 11.4 The Planning Inspectorate will decide whether the application meets the required standards to proceed to examination and will determine whether our consultation has been adequate.

Your data, your rights

- 11.6 On 25 May 2018, the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) became law. The law requires National Highways to explain to you consultees, stakeholders and customers how your personal data will be used and stored. National Highways adheres to the government's consultation principles, the Planning Act 2008 as required, and may collect personal data to help shape development of highways schemes. Personal data collected by the project team will be processed and retained by National Highways and its appointed contractors until the Scheme is complete. Under the GDPR regulations you have the following rights:
 - Right of access to the data (Subject Access Request)
 - Right for the rectification of errors
 - Right to erasure of personal data this is not an absolute right under the legislation
 - Right to restrict processing or to object to processing
 - Right to data portability
- 11.7 If, at any point, National Highways plans to process the personal data we hold for a purpose other than that for which it was originally collected, we will tell you what that other purpose is. We will do this prior to any further processing taking place and we



will include any relevant additional information, including your right to object to that further processing.

- 11.8 You have the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority, the Information Commissioners Office.
