#### 1 Introduction

#### 1.1 Purpose of this document

- 1.1.1 This Adequacy of Consultation Milestone (this "AoCM") has been produced by National Highways (the "Applicant") for the forthcoming application for development consent on the A46 Coventry Junctions (Walsgrave) Scheme (the "Scheme"). The application for development consent is planned in November 2024.
- 1.1.2 This AoCM sets out the consultation undertaken for the Scheme in preparing the application for development consent, confirms the approaches set out in Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC) and a summary of the consultation responses and how they have shaped the application for development consent. A more detailed explanation of how the Scheme has met the requirements under section 42, section 47, section 48 and section 49 of the Planning Act 2008 will be available in the Consultation Report to be submitted with the application.
- 1.1.3 The Applicant has sought the views of local authorities on the adequacy of the consultation undertake on the Scheme to support this AoCM. Details of the letters issued to the local authorities can be found at Annex A of this AoCM. Section 5 of this AoCM details their responses and supporting evidence can be found at Annex B of this AoCM.
- 1.1.4 This AoCM is a requirement established in the 'Planning Act 2008: Preapplication stage for Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects' (April 2024) guidance and the 'Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects: 2024 Preapplication Prospectus' (May 2024). It has been prepared in line with this guidance.

## **1.8.** 25 October – 22 December 2023

Full statutory consultation undertaken under section 42 and section 47 and publicised under section 48 of the 2008 Act.

This full statutory consultation included the distribution of consultation material to approximately 11,500 properties in a mailing zone around the proposed junction. It also included statutory notification of all identified prescribed bodies, relevant local authorities and those with a defined interest in land potentially affected by the proposals.

#### **1.10.** Targeted Statutory Consultation

## **1.11.** 23 August to 20 September 2024

Following the statutory consultation, the Applicant identified additional potential Category 3 interests through a change in the methodology used to identify these consultees, compared to the method previous used at statutory consultation. This consultation included the distribution of information to newly identified persons with an interest in land, who were provided an opportunity to comment on the statutory consultation proposals and the supplementary consultation. Further information about this consultation will be set out in the Consultation Report.

#### 1.12. Targeted Supplementary Consultation (Non-Statutory)

## **1.13.** 23 August to 20 September 2024

Following the statutory consultation, the Applicant carried out a targeted supplementary consultation on 19 proposed changes to the Scheme. This consultation was targeted to those persons with an interest in land where the Order Limits had been amended or where there had been a change in the land powers that would be sought in the DCO application. The Applicant also notified Coventry City Council, Rugby Borough Council and Warwickshire County Council. Further information about this consultation will be set out in the Consultation Report.



#### 3 Statement of Community Consultation

#### 3.1 Preparing the Statement of Community Consultation

3.1.1 The Applicant agreed the approaches within the final Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC) published at statutory consultation with Coventry City Council, Rugby Borough Council and Warwickshire County Council in October 2023 following consultation on the SoCC in July 2023. I am writing to you about the A46 Coventry Junctions (Walsgrave) scheme (the "Scheme") and the adequacy of our consultation undertaken between 25 October and 6 December 2023 in preparing our application for development consent due in November 2024.

Once our application for development consent is submitted, the Planning Inspectorate will consider whether we have complied with the Pre-application procedure. As part of this process, the Inspectorate will request local authorities to submit an Adequacy of Consultation Representation when deciding whether to accept an application for examination.

You may be aware that following guidance published by the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (now known as the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government) in April 2024 and an updated Planning Inspectorate Prospectus in May 2024, we are now required to provide the Planning Inspectorate with an Adequacy of Consultation Milestone submission ahead of the planned application for development consent. This will allow us to minimise the risk of the Application not being accepted for Examination by ensuring that the consultation has been undertaken adequately and in line with the commitments made in the Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC) and our statutory duties set out in the Planning Act 2008.

You will recall that we consulted you on a draft SoCC in July 2023, before finalising and publishing it in October 2023. The table at the end of this letter sets out the commitments made in the SoCC and how we have complied with those in undertaking the consultation to ensure its adequacy. As part of confirming the adequacy of the consultation we are required to consult with host local authorities to seek your views.

Our assessment of compliance shows there is only one instance, set out in item 19, where we have not fully complied with a commitment, which was to issue two press releases, but in fact only one was issued.




**Consultation Zone – Consultation distribution for posted information**
