I unfortunately do not have the vocabulary, the information or the time to provide you with all the facts I would like to, therefore I can only make this personal, heartfelt plea and hope you look beyond the huge benefit for a few businessmen and take a wider view of how this will negatively impact many, many lives in an area that has worked very hard to improve, employment is on the upward turn, and tourism income is at record highs.
