The questions that begs to be answered is how many times does one need to prove NO NEED FOR THE REOPENING OF THE AIRPORT?

Are we flogging a dead horse here? If all these reports could find no need before Covid then surely there will be even less need now. Furthermore it is beyond belief that the DCO was initially granted in the face of overwhelming evidence.

One of the arguments in favour of the reopening of Manston as an airport is the question of employment. 30,000 jobs is the figure quoted by the applicant (RSP). Our local MP's declare that Thanet suffers chronic unemployment. However this belies the fact that in reality employment in Thanet has risen since the closure of the airport. The local tourism industry is booming especially since Covid with the number of staycations rising. Numbers of unemployment have indeed dropped so low that Sir Roger Gale (MP NorthThanet) was lamenting the lack of agricultural workers and drivers on September 15 2021 during a parliamentary debate.

As an aside may I state that Southend airport when it closed earlier this year only employed 480 people. That is a far, far cry from the figure of 30,000 bandied about.

At COP26 the UK government pledged to carbon emissions by 78% by 2035. Allowing further airport expansion cannot be helping towards this strategy. I hope that rather than empty rhetoric the Department of Transport and thereby the UK government will act and reject the proposal for the reopening of Manston
